

Summary

This bulletin provides information about the operation of the Northeast Order during 2006 through a series of tables and charts. The *Bulletin* Highlights section summarizes important events that impacted the dairy industry in 2006. Also included are lists of handlers and cooperatives operating under the Order.

Producer Milk Receipts Lower in 2006

During 2006, the volume of milk received from producers shipping to handlers regulated under the Northeast Order totaled 22.7 billion pounds, a decrease of 3.8 percent from 2005. The average number of producers declined 4.2 percent, while average daily deliveries per producer (DDP) increased only 0.4 percent.

Total producer milk receipts were down considerably in 2006. During November, the total amount of milk pooled on the Order set a record for the smallest monthly volume since the Order's inception in 2000, but the highest Class I utilization percentage at 52.3 percent. Overall, the total amount of milk pooled on the Northeast Order finished 885.6 million pounds less than during 2005. This was a combined result of poorer feed, less expansion due to lower prices the previous year, and less use of rBST. Nationally, milk production rose 2.8 percent, following an increase of 3.8 percent in 2005. In the Northeast milkshed (the area from which milk is traditionally pooled by handlers selling into the Marketing Area), milk production was nearly flat (0.1 percent increase).

The year ended with 564 less producers than at the end of 2005. Annual average daily deliveries per producer (DDP) equaled 4349 pounds, up slightly (0.4 percent) from 2005. No milk was depooled during 2006.

Class Utilization Changes

With less overall producer milk receipts, the volumes utilized in each of the categories declined. Class I utilization averaged 46.5 percent in 2006, an increase of 1.5 percentage points from the previous year. The total volume of milk used in Class I decreased slightly (0.6 percent), but because of a smaller volume of producer milk receipts, the change in utilization was positive. For the other classes, both the total volume and their respective utilization percentages dropped. Class II usage decreased 4.8 percent, resulting in a decrease in utilization of 0.3 percentage points. Class III volume was down 5.6 percent with a drop in utilization of 0.4 percentage points. The amount of milk used in Class IV declined 3.8 percent in 2006; utilization dropped 0.8 percentage points.

Prices Lower

National milk production was strong during the first quarter of 2006 but lost its momentum in the

spring. As the supply tightened, prices began to rise, but not until the fall. For the year, all federal order class prices averaged less than during 2005 with double-digit declines.

The Class I price averaged \$15.13 per hundredweight in 2006, \$2.52 below the 2005 annual average. The highest Class I price during 2006 was \$16.63 in both January and February. The Class II price averaged \$1.72 less than the previous year and the Class IV price was down \$1.82 from 2005. Once again, the Class III price was hit the hardest, averaging \$2.16 per hundredweight less than the 2005 average. Overall, the statistical uniform price (blend) reported at Suffolk County, Massachusetts (Boston) averaged \$13.53 per hundredweight, \$2.11 (13.5 percent) less than the 2005 price.

MILC Program

The original Milk Income Loss Contract (MILC) program was authorized by the 2002 Farm Bill through September 30, 2005. The Agricultural Reconciliation Act of 2005, signed February 8, 2006, reauthorized the program until September 30, 2007, calling it MILCX. The extended program uses the same baseline price of \$16.94 per hundredweight; however, it multiplies the difference by 34 percent (versus 45 percent used under the old program) with essentially no payment during the last month (September 2007). Payments were retroactive to October 1, 2005, making June and December the only months during 2005 that MILC payments were made. During each month of 2006, the Class I price reported at Suffolk County, Massachusetts, was below the threshold of \$16.94 per hundredweight. Payments averaged about 61 cents per hundredweight.

Component Pricing

The price paid to producers for butterfat averaged \$1.3252 per pound, 22.5 percent less than the \$1.7105 per pound in 2005. The per-pound annual average protein price declined 15 percent from \$2.4602 to \$2.0912. The other solids price increased 42.2 percent jumping from \$0.1228 to \$0.1746 per pound. The nonfat solids price dropped 6.7 percent from \$0.7929 to \$0.7400 per pound.


Producer Tests

The annual average producer butterfat test increased from 3.67 percent in 2005 to 3.71 percent in 2006. From January through October, producer butterfat tests averaged 0.04 to 0.08 points higher when compared to the same month during the previous year and set records for the highest tests since the Order's inception in many months; only November and December were below. Both the producer protein and other solids tests averaged 1 hundredth of a point higher than the previous year. •









Bulletin Highlights - 2006

January

A summary was given of the Market Administrator marketing services' verification and calibration 2005 programs provided for producers who do not receive such services from a cooperative. A table showed the tank calibration work by tank size.

Sales of Class I fluid milk products in the Northeast Milk Marketing Area were down 0.5 percent from 2004, and a table showed volume and percent change information for 2004 and 2005. A chart illustrated per capita sales by product for 2005.

The downward pressure on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange (CME) prices was due to the fact that demand could not keep pace with increased milk production. Charts illustrated the CME block Cheddar cheese and Grade AA butter prices from August 2005 to February 2006.

Selected Northeast Order statistics from 2001 to 2005 were given in a chart that illustrated producer milk receipts and a table that showed the annual average producer pay prices.

February

USDA announced three recommended decisions that affected the following orders: Mideast (Order No. 33); Central (Order No. 32); and Upper Midwest (Order No. 30). Also, USDA announced a final rule affecting the following orders: Pacific Northwest (Order No. 124) and Arizona-Las Vegas (Order No. 131).

Total milk production registered an increase of 3.8 percent in 2005 compared to 2004; in the Northeast milkshed, milk production increased 3.5 percent. A table ranked the top ten milk producing states.

The Milk Income Loss Contract (MILC) sign-up program was discussed, and information was given on where to apply.

A tentative calibration truck schedule for 2006 was given in a table.

Average daily deliveries per producer by federal order for 2005 was discussed and illustrated with a map pointing out the order regions.

March

The cost of two federal government programs—the Milk Price Support Program (MPS) and the Milk Income Loss Contract (MILC—and how they impacted what producers received for their milk was explained. A chart displayed the proportion of program payments by region.

The results from the November 2005 container biennial sales survey for the Northeast Milk Marketing Area were explained. Charts illustrated sales by product type and container size.

A calculator to estimate farmers' MILC payments was placed on the Northeast Order's website.

A pool summary for all federal orders was given in a table for January–March, 2005–2006.

April

USDA announced publication of a final rule to amend all federal milk marketing orders. A referendum was not required because the legislation was passed by Congress and signed by the President. Congress sought to ensure regulatory equity between and among all dairy farmers and handlers for sales of packaged fluid milk in federally regulated milk marketing areas and into certain non-federally regulated milk marketing areas from federally regulated areas.

USDA released their *Dairy Products 2005 Summary* publication, and a discussion was given of dairy products manufactured in the United States. A table showed selected U.S. manufactured dairy products for 2004 and 2005.

Highlights based on pool statistics were given for New York State, and a map showed the location of plants regulated by the Northeast Order during March 2006.

May

USDA issued a recommended decision to amend the Class I fluid milk product definition for all federal milk marketing orders.

Farm operations with a tanker load per day were compared by farm size and state and shown in tables for January 2002 and 2006.

Highlights based on pool statistics were given for Pennsylvania, and a map showed the location of plants regulated by the Northeast Order during April 2006.

June

USDA announced its intent to reconvene a national public hearing to assure that any changes to manufacturing allowance factors used in federal order Class III and Class IV product price formulas were appropriate and reflective of manufacturing costs.

An explanation was given of how the changes in utilization affected the uniform price. A chart illustrated the change from the 5-year average in class utilization from January to June 2006.

A pool summary for all federal orders was given in a table for January–June, 2005–2006.

Highlights based on pool statistics were given for Vermont, and a map showed the location of plants regulated by the Northeast Order during May 2006.

July

Milk production in the United States during 2006 was up during the first quarter but tapered off during the second quarter. A table ranked the top ten milk production states.

In 2005, the Northeast Regional Dairy Outlook Conference consensus correctly estimated lower prices in 2006 but underestimated how low. A chart showed the estimated vs. the actual 2006 uniform price.

Component tests were compared with charts illustrating producer butterfat, protein, and other solids tests.

August

On September 14, USDA reconvened a national public hearing to assure that any changes to manufacturing allowance factors used in federal order Class III and IV product price formulas were appropriate and reflective of manufacturing costs.

USDA announced a number of decisions on pooling and transportation credits that impacted provisions in several federal milk marketing orders.

Trends in U.S. milk production were discussed; a table showed the pounds pooled by producers under the Northeast Order by state for July 2000 and 2006.

Mailbox prices were explained, and a map illustrated the regional mailbox prices in the Northeast milkshed for June 2006.

September

Bulk milk movements by handlers pooled on the Northeast Order as well as by handlers pooled on other federal orders were discussed. A table illustrated the milk movements to and from the Northeast Order for the months of August and September in 2004, 2005, and 2006.

Northeast Class I sales declined slightly, and organic sales trended upward. Tables illustrated the average in-area Class I and organic sales in the Northeast Order from September 2005 to September 2006.

A pool summary for all federal orders was given in a table for January–September, 2005 and 2006.

The Commodity Credit Corporation (CCC) purchased only nonfat dry milk for the marketing year October 1, 2005, through September 30, 2006. A table gave the amount of butter, cheese, and nonfat dry milk the CCC purchased from 1991 through 2006.

October

USDA announced a public information session for interested parties to learn about the intent of proposals that have been submitted to amend the federal order Class III and Class IV product price formulas.

Farm operations with a tanker load per day were compared by farm size and state and shown in tables for May 2002 and 2006.

USDA announced a number of final rules that adopted amendments to the Central, Mideast, and Upper Midwest federal milk marketing orders.

A comparison of receipts and utilization by zones was given, and a map illustrated selected statistics by zone differential range under the Northeast Order for September 2006.

November

A referendum was underway on a tentative final decision to amend the manufacturing (make) allowances contained in the Class III and Class IV price formulas applicable for all federal orders. USDA issued this decision in November, which was based on an emergency public hearing in January 2006.

The 2006 Northeast Regional Dairy Outlook Conference was held on November 21 at the Northeast Order's Albany office. A table showed the statistical uniform prices for 2005, the actual and estimated prices for 2006, and the estimated prices for 2007.

A calendar was given that showed the dates for partial payments to producers who are not members of cooperatives. The Order requirement was explained.

For the first time since the Order's inception, the November Class II price was the lowest class price of any that month, falling below Class III and Class IV.

December

USDA placed the implementation of the pricing provisions of the Class III and Class IV make allowance on hold pending litigation introduced by the opposition.

A summary was given of the Market Administrator marketing services' verification and calibration 2006 programs provided for producers who do not receive such services from a cooperative. A table showed the tank calibration work by tank size.

Selected Northeast Order statistics for 2006 were summarized, and a chart illustrated the Order's pool statistics for 2005 and 2006.

During the 2006 calendar year, the CCC purchased only a small amount of cheese and 64 million pounds of nonfat dry milk under the price support program; no butter was purchased.

Nonfat dry milk prices were strong at the CME due to international demand. A chart illustrated the monthly nonfat dry milk inventory for January 2004 through December 2006.

A pool summary for all federal orders was given in a table for January–December, 2005 and 2006.


