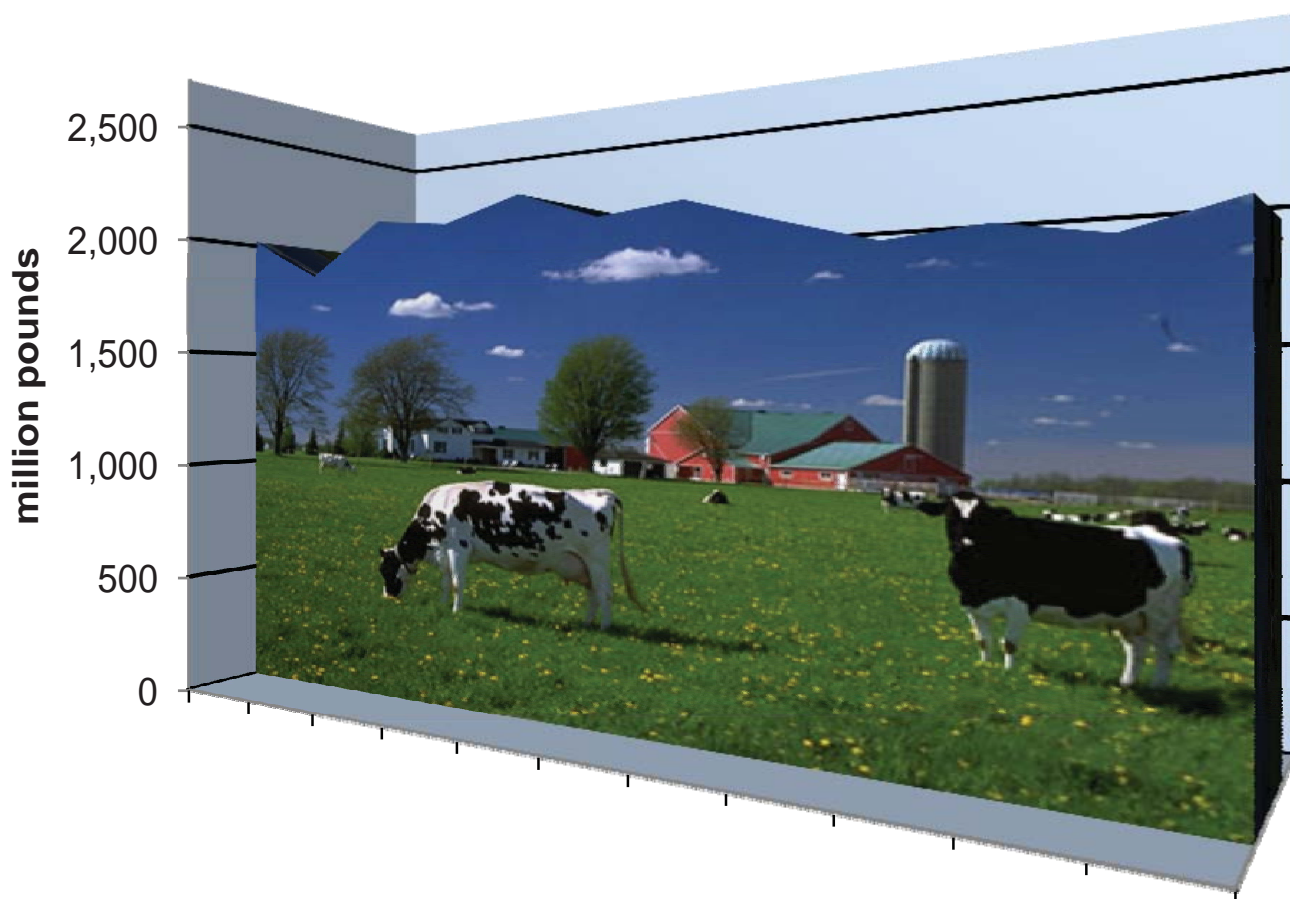

Summary

This bulletin provides information about the operation of the Northeast Order during 2009 through a series of tables and charts. The *Bulletin* Highlights section summarizes important events that impacted the dairy industry in 2009. Also included are lists of handlers and cooperatives operating under the Order with their respective locations depicted on a map of the region.

Producer Milk Receipts Decline

During 2009, the volume of milk received from producers shipping to handlers regulated under the Northeast Order totaled 23.5 billion pounds, a decrease of 1.4 percent from 2008. The decline was primarily due to decreased milk production in the region, generally a response to the lower prices.

Nationally, total milk production from January through November was flat on a percent change basis. Milk production in the Northeast milkshed (the area from which milk traditionally is pooled by handlers selling into the marketing area) decreased 0.5 percent in 2009 compared to the national decline of 0.1 percent. The 3 top Northeast producing states (New York, Pennsylvania, and Vermont) had a combined decrease of 0.3 percent. Production in New York and Pennsylvania was relatively flat, while Vermont declined 3.9 percent. The combined New England states (Connecticut, Massachusetts, Maine, New Hampshire, Rhode Island, and Vermont) reported a decline of 3.1 percent while the remaining milkshed states (Delaware, Maryland, New Jersey, Virginia, and West Virginia) showed a combined drop of 1.3 percent from 2008.

Nationally, the number of milk cows decreased 1.2 percent in 2009. In the Northeast, milk cow numbers declined 1.4 percent. Average milk production per cow grew 1.2 percent nationally; for the Northeast, the increase was 1.0 percent.

The year ended with 416 less producers pooled on the Order than at the end of 2008. Annual average daily deliveries per producer (DDP) equaled 4,810 pounds, relatively unchanged from 2008.

A small amount (23.5 million pounds) of milk was depooled during 2009, due to inverse prices, significantly less than the approximately 300 million pounds during 2008. If the depooled pounds were included in the total pooled milk receipts for both years, the actual change would have been a decline of 2.5 percent in 2009. All volume comparisons have been adjusted for leap year in 2008.

Class Utilization Changes

Class I utilization averaged 43.7 percent in 2009, an increase of 0.3 percentage points from the previous year. The total volume of milk used in Class I decreased 0.9 percent, but due to the decline in total milk receipts, the utilization percent increased. Class II usage increased 2.3 percent, resulting in an increase in utilization of

0.7 percentage points and an overall pool utilization of 20.2 percent.

Class III volume was up 4.2 percent. Utilization increased 1.3 percentage points to 23.5 percent. The amount of milk used in Class IV dropped 16.2 percent in 2009 and the corresponding utilization declined 2.2 percentage points. Class IV utilization accounted for an annual average of 12.6 percent. Most of the decline was in milk used to make dried milk products, mainly nonfat dry milk, and was affected by the tightness in the milk supply and reduced demand.

Prices Lower

The increases in milk production that occurred during late 2007 and early 2008, and a pullback in both domestic and international demand during the worldwide economic slowdown, caused a depression in prices that began during the second half of 2008 and continued throughout most of 2009. For the year, all federal order class prices averaged less than during 2008; most were down about 30 percent from the previous year.

The Class I price averaged \$14.73 per hundredweight in 2009, \$6.52 (30.7 percent) below the 2008 annual average. The Class II price averaged \$11.26 per hundredweight, nearly \$5.00 less than the previous year, and the same percent decrease as Class I. The Class III price averaged \$11.36 per hundredweight, a drop of over \$6.00, and 34.9 percent less than the 2008 average. The Class IV price declined \$3.76, a decrease of 25.7 percent, and averaged \$10.89 per hundredweight.

Overall, the statistical uniform price (blend) reported at Suffolk County, Massachusetts (Boston), averaged \$13.01 per hundredweight, \$5.61 (30.1 percent) less than the 2008 price. It was the second lowest annual average blend price on record for the Order. The producer price differential (PPD) averaged \$1.65 per hundredweight, 39.8 percent higher than the average in 2008.

Component Pricing

The price paid to producers for butterfat averaged \$1.2571 per pound, 19.8 percent lower than in 2008. The per-pound annual average protein price was \$2.2087, down 43.2 percent from 2008. The other solids price increased 10.3 percent and averaged \$0.0612 per pound. The nonfat solids price declined 29.2 percent and averaged \$0.7469 per pound.

Producer Tests

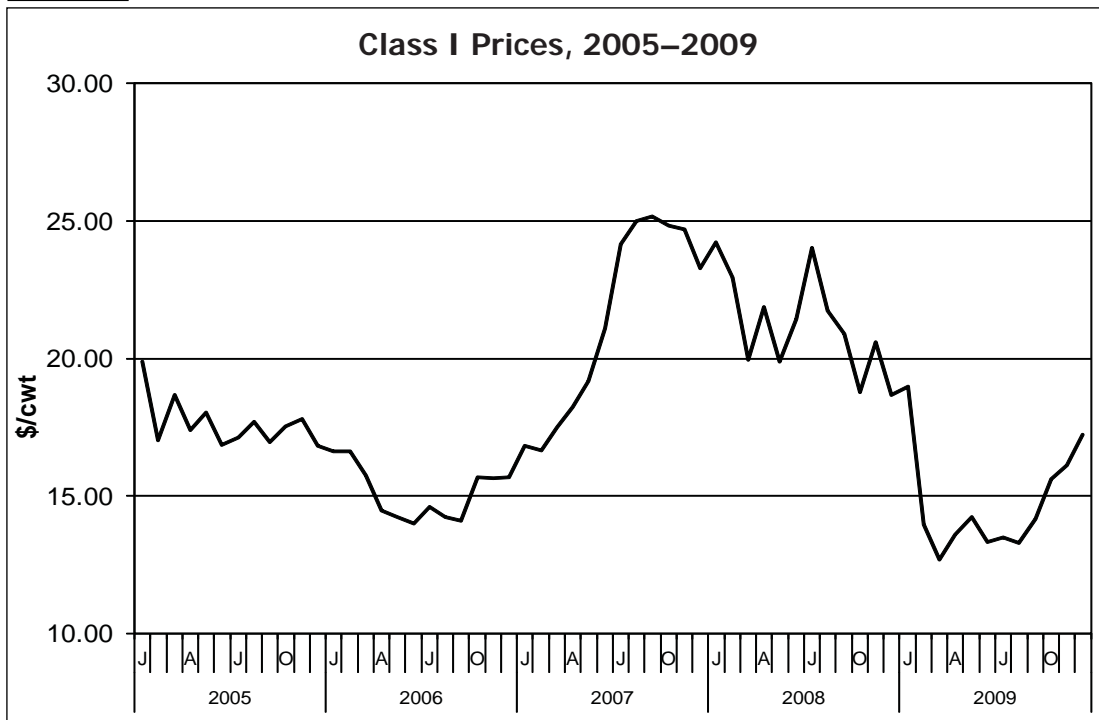
The annual average producer butterfat test equaled 3.72 percent in 2009, a drop of 0.01 percentage point from last year. New record highs were set during the months of January and July. The annual average producer protein test was unchanged from 2008 and equaled 3.06 percent. Record highs were set during the months of January, June, September, and October. The annual average producer other solids test dropped 0.02 percentage points to 5.69 percent.

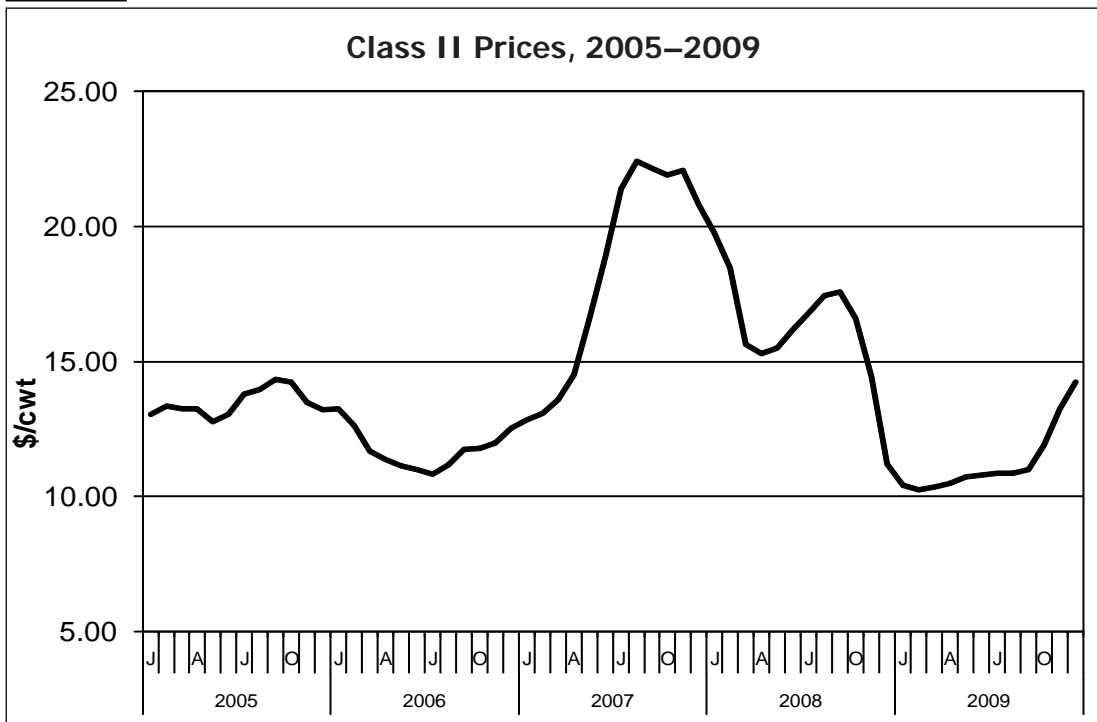

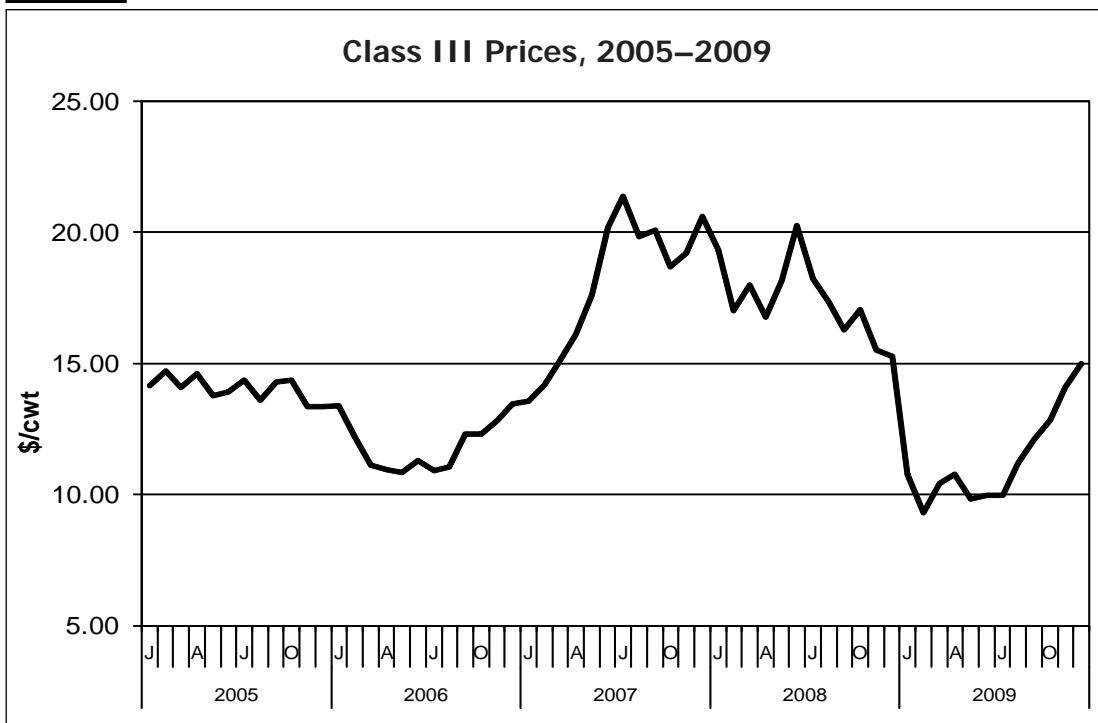

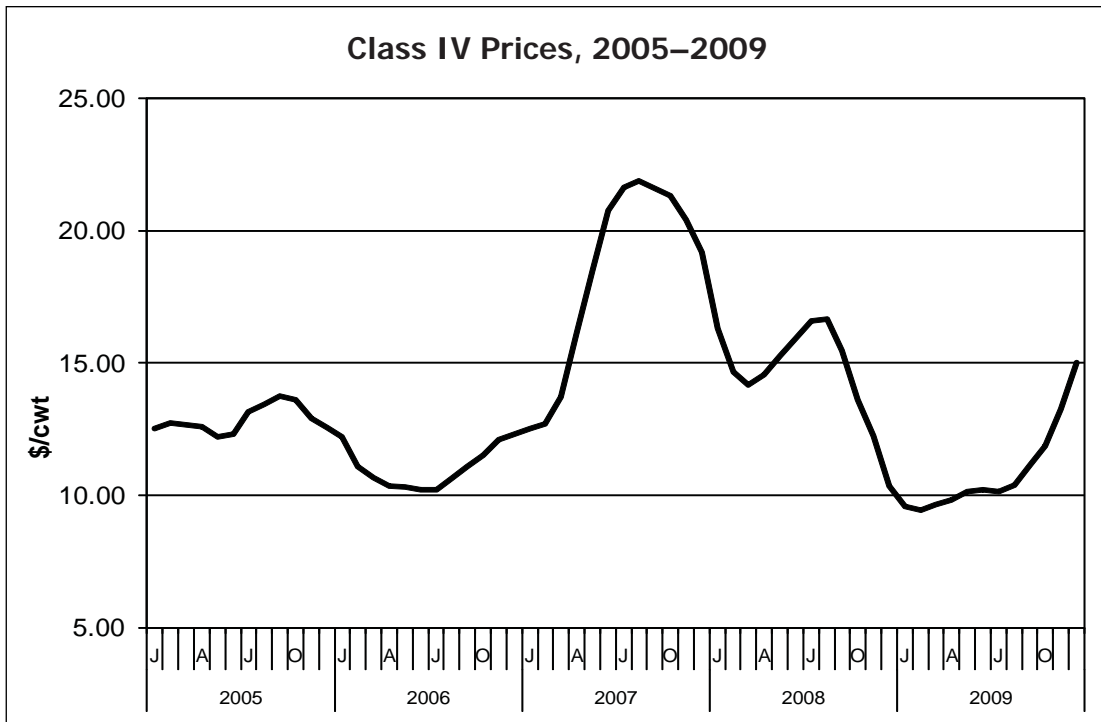

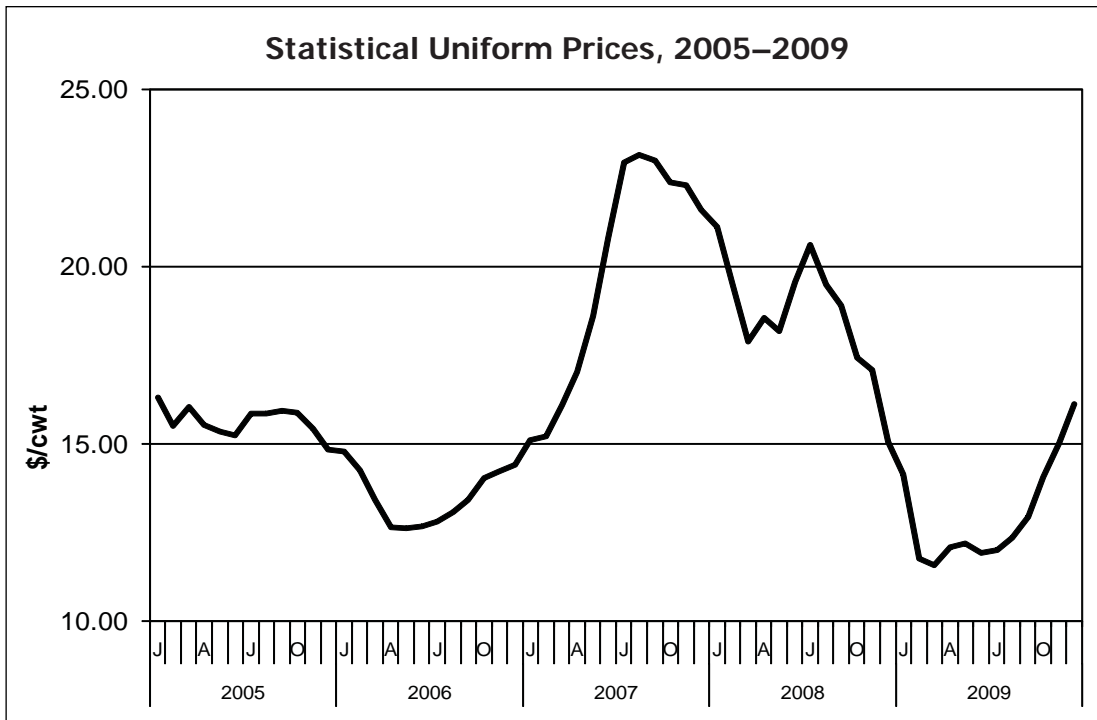
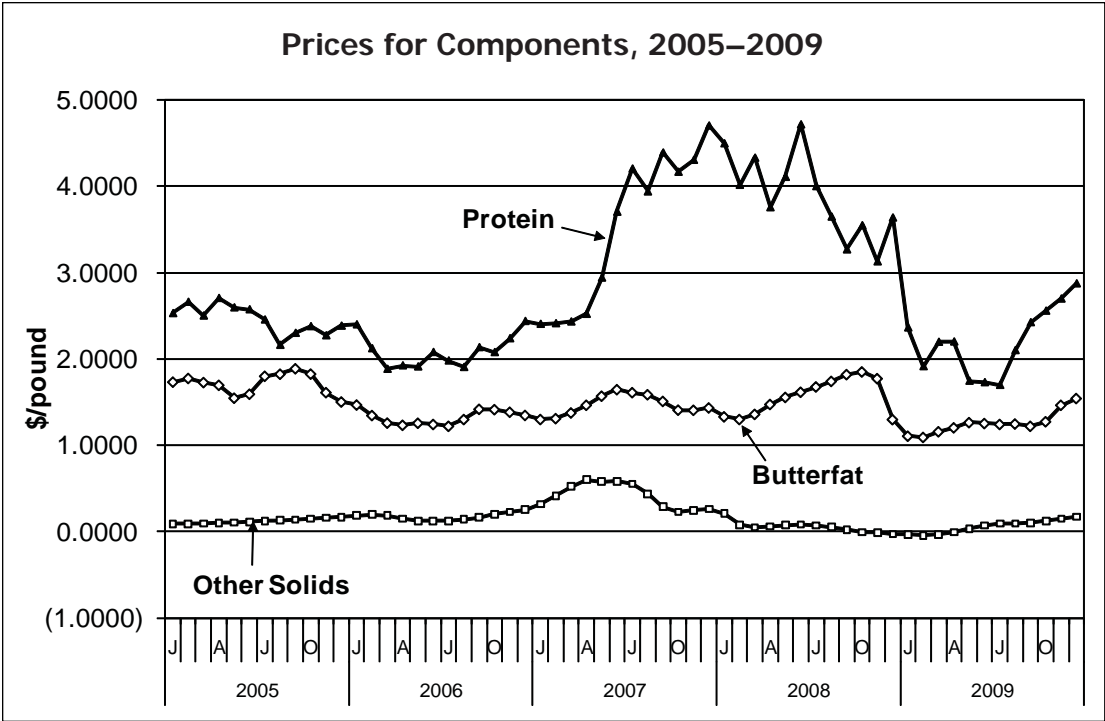

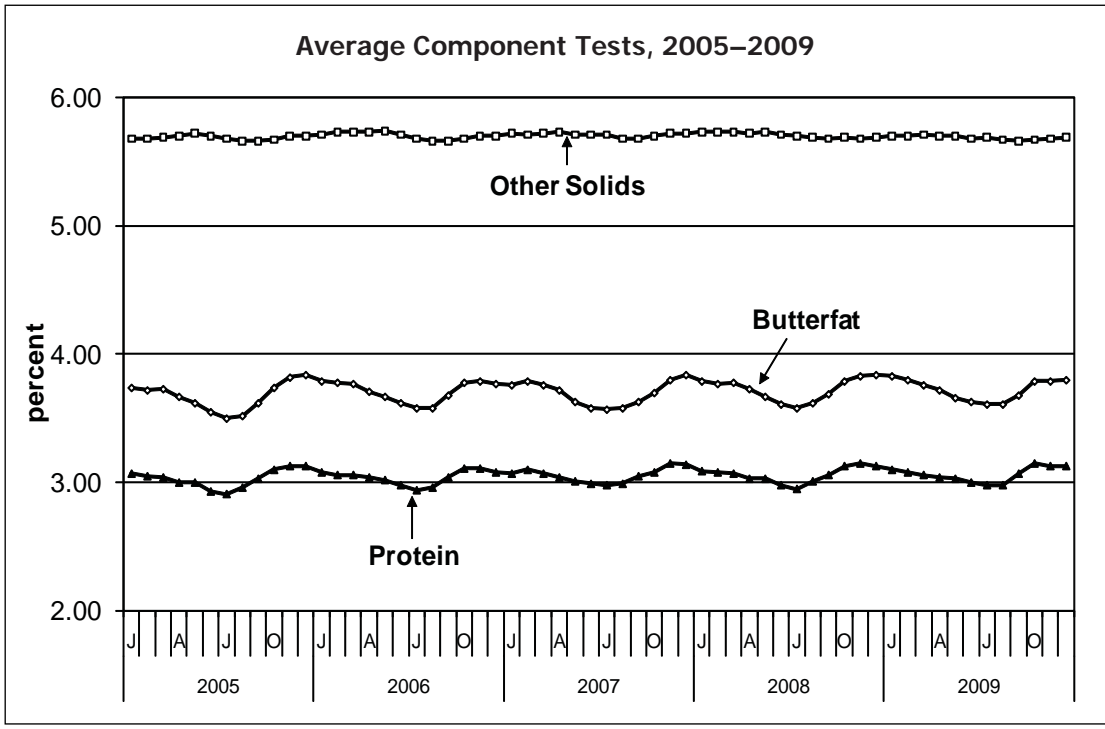

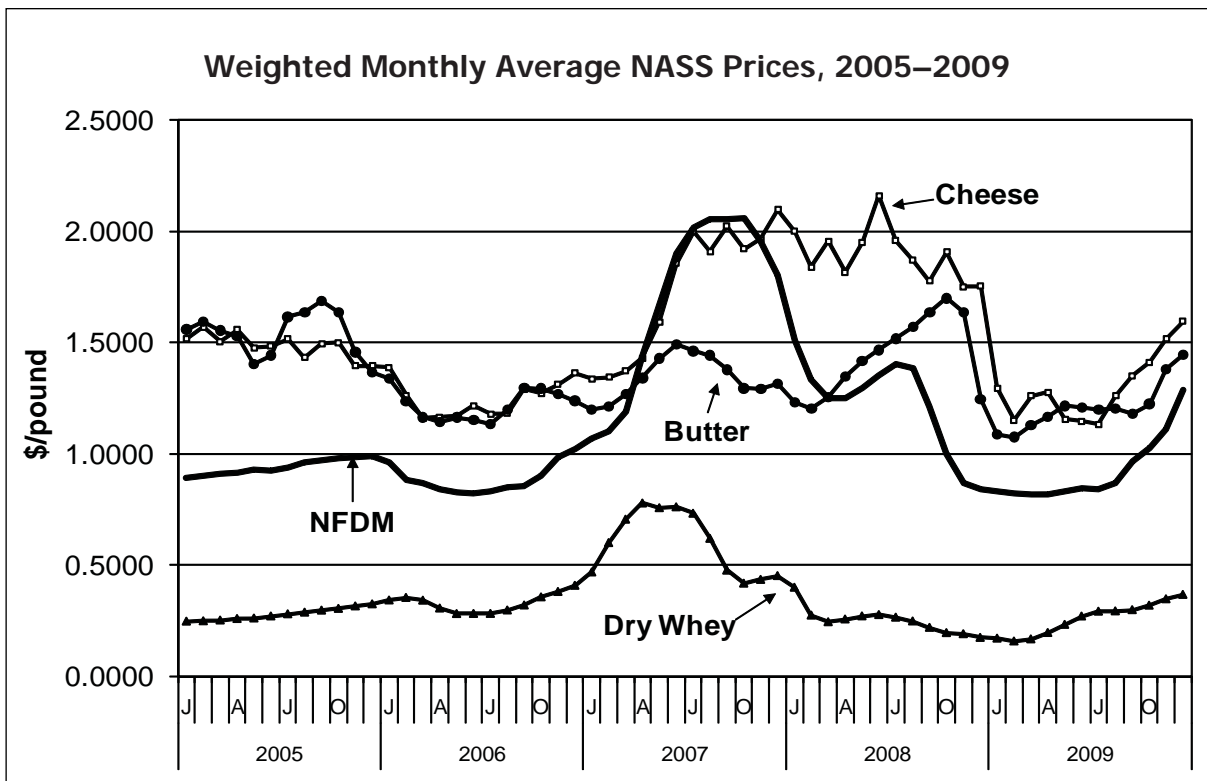

9 Receipts of Milk from Producers by State*, 2009

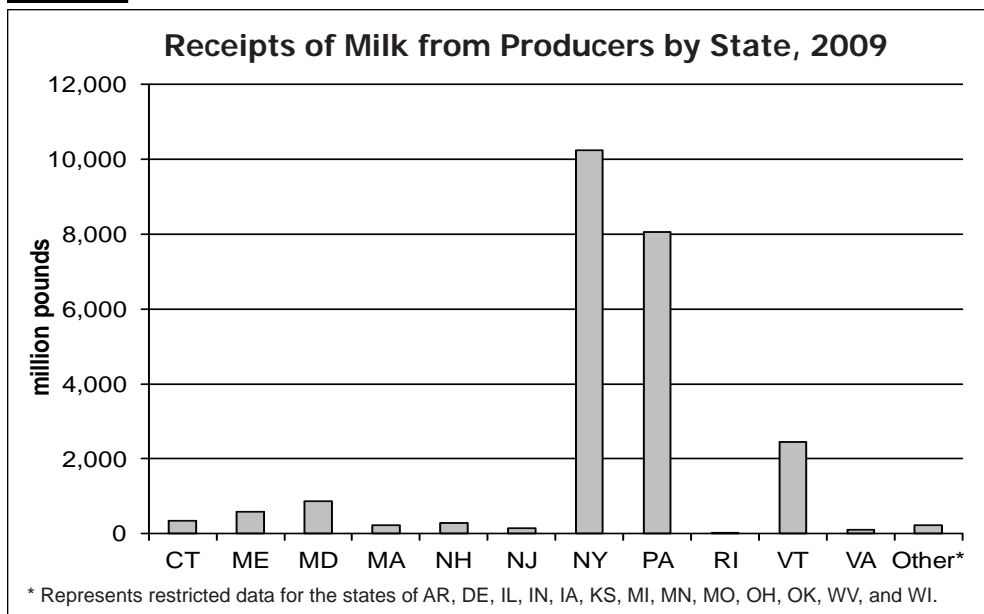

10 Number of Producers by State*, 2009

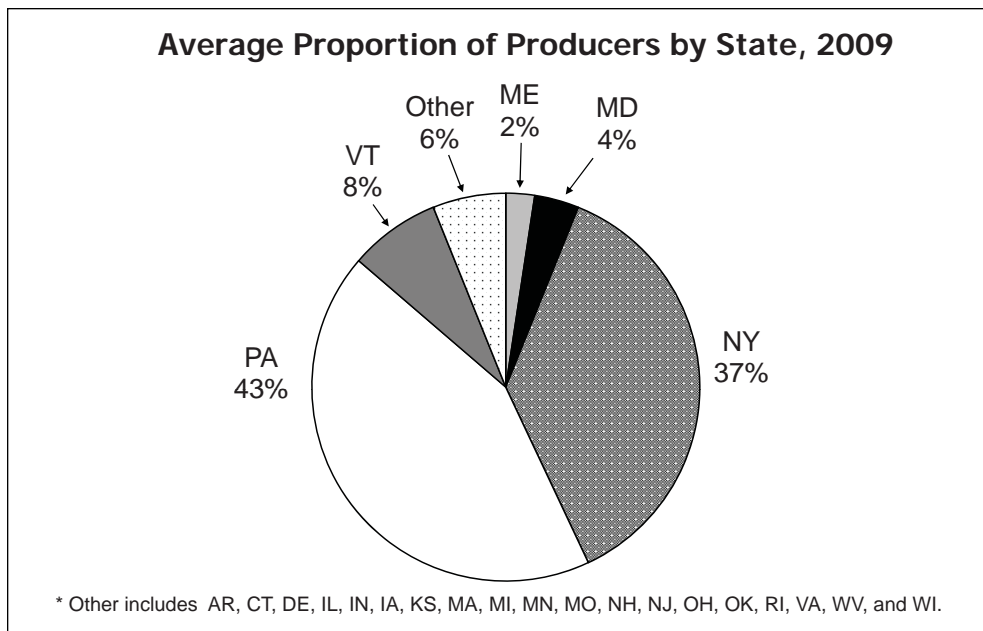

11 Daily Average Output of Producer Milk per Farm by State*, 2009

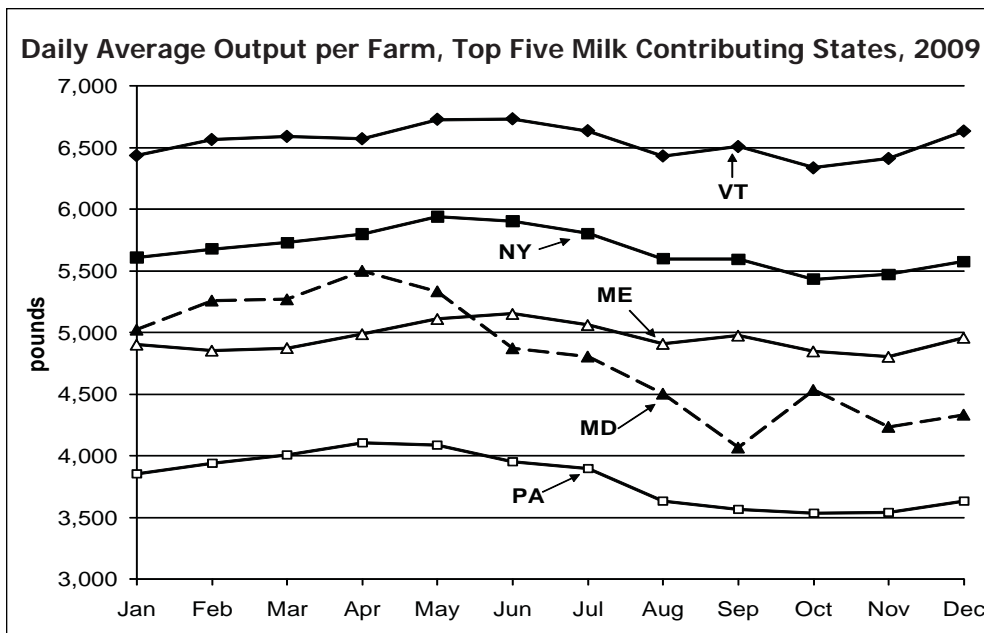

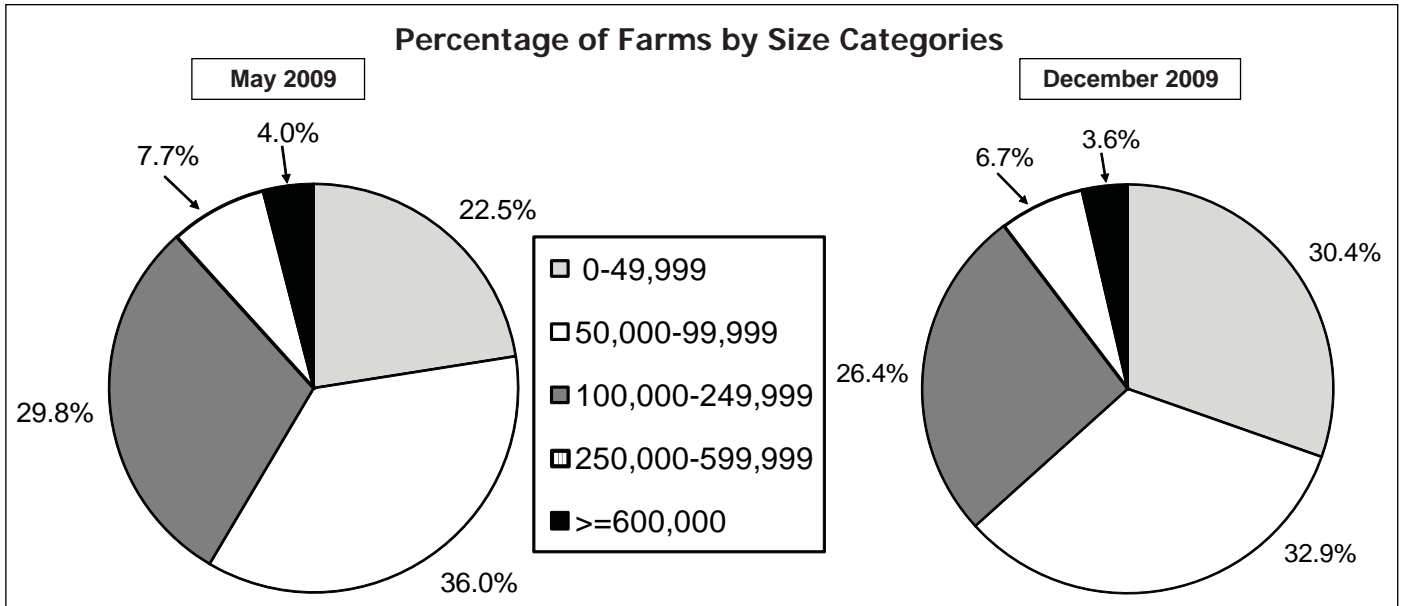

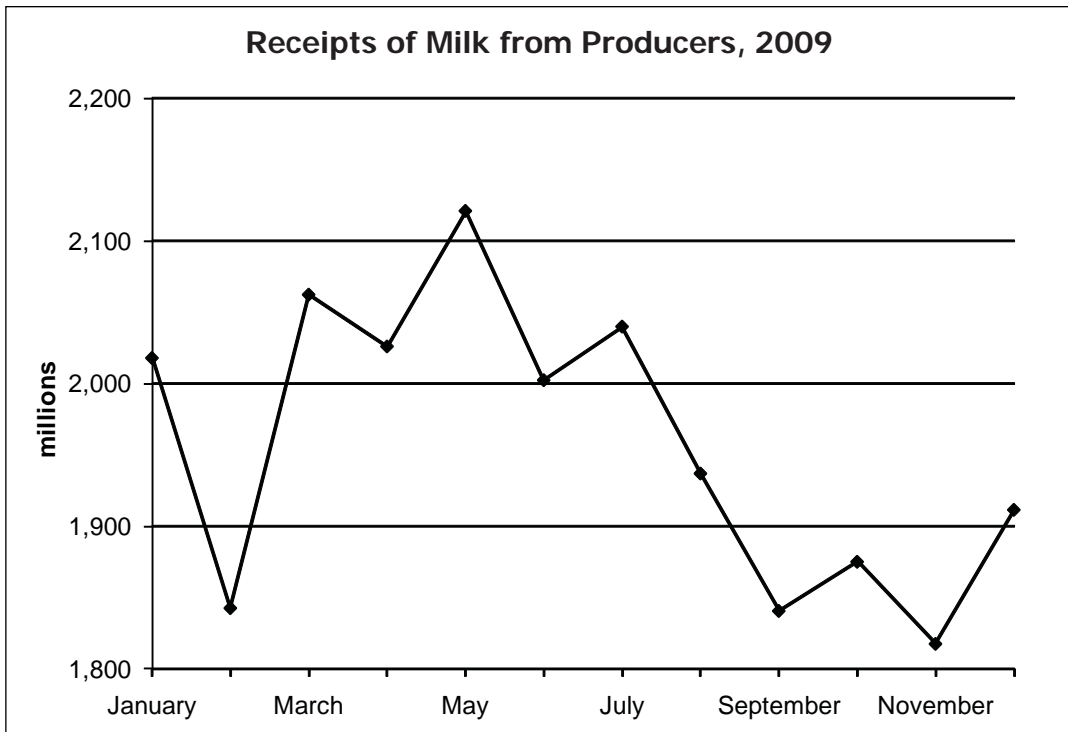

Bulletin Highlights —2009

January

USDA released an invitation to submit proposals for consideration at a public hearing to discuss elimination of the producer-handler provisions and revision of the exempt plant provision in all federal orders.

Sales of Class I fluid milk products for 2008 in the Northeast Milk Marketing Area totaled nearly 9.2 billion pounds, a decrease of 1.3 percent from 2007. Volume and percent change information for 2007 and 2008 were shown in a table along with per capita sales data.

Based on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange (CME) futures markets data, the Northeast Order's Uniform Price was estimated to be the lowest in 5 and a half years for February through April 2009. A table illustrated estimated uniform prices and Milk Income Loss Contract (MILC) payments for February–April 2009.

A pool summary for all federal orders was given in a table for January–December, 2007 and 2008.

February

USDA issued a notice extending the deadline for submitting proposals and announced a pre-hearing public information session would be held to discuss elimination of the producer-handler provisions and revision of the exempt plant provision in all federal orders.

U.S. Milk production grew 2.1 percent in 2008, the same percentage as in 2007. A table ranked the top ten states by 2008 production.

The market service department checked 481 farm bulk tanks throughout the Northeast Marketing Area milkshed during the 2008 season. An accompanying table illustrated the 2008 tank calibrations work by tank size.

Average daily deliveries per producer (DDP) under the Northeast Order increased substantially from 2000 to 2008. A chart showed the DDP for selected states under the Northeast Order for 2000 and 2008.

Based on the February 2009 Class I price at Boston, MA, of \$13.97 per hundredweight, the MILC payment was estimated at \$1.62 per hundredweight.

March

USDA announced a public hearing on the elimination of the producer-handler provisions and revision of the exempt plant provision in all federal orders.

Other solids and dry whey component prices were projected and accompanied by a chart illustrating the actual and estimated prices for October 2008 through December 2009.

The Northeast Milk Marketing Area announced the tentative calibration truck schedule for 2009.

Average component tests in the Northeast Marketing Area were discussed and charts highlighted

the relationship between monthly component price and component test for protein, butterfat, and other solids from January 2002 through 2009.

A pool summary for all federal orders was given in a table for January–March, 2008 and 2009.

April

MILC payments were projected through November 2009, based on market conditions and outlook as of May 15. An accompanying table showed estimated prices for April–December 2009 and the annual average for 2009.

The contribution to the producer blend price by components was discussed and accompanied by a table showing the contribution by component for the month of April for 2006 through 2009, using a hypothetical farmer producing 100,000 pounds of milk at the pool average component tests during that month.

Northeast Order total producer receipts declined 2.8 percent in the first 3 months of 2009. Northeast Order utilization was discussed, accompanied by a table illustrating utilization of selected products for January–March 2009.

May

USDA announced hearing transcripts available for viewing from a public hearing held in May 2009 on the elimination of the producer-handler provisions and revision of the exempt plant provision in all federal orders.

Weighted average butterfat and protein tests by county, and the top 15 production counties ranked under the Northeast Order for 2008, were discussed and accompanied by maps illustrating the data.

USDA released their *Dairy Products 2008 Summary*, a publication reporting dairy products manufactured in the United States. A table showed selected U.S. manufactured dairy products for 2007 and 2008.

June

Total producer receipts declined less than 1 percent for the first 6 months of 2009 under the Northeast Order. Discussion on the decline and the effect of depooling were discussed, accompanied by a table illustrating utilization for selected products for January through June 2008 and 2009.

The market situation and other factors that resulted in a statistical uniform price below \$12.25 per hundredweight for a fifth month in a row at Boston, MA, were discussed. A table showed the commercial disappearance of total milk and selected dairy products for January through April, 2008 and 2009.

A pool summary for all federal orders was given in a table for January–June, 2008 and 2009.

July

Agriculture Secretary Vilsack announced a temporary increase in the amount paid for dairy products through the Dairy Product Price Support Program, effective from August through October 2009.

The number of producers by size of milk marketings for May 2009 was compared to May 2003 and May 2006. Two tables showed the number of farms by pooled pounds and farms marketing more than 1.5 million pounds per month, by state, under the Northeast Order for May 2003, 2006, and 2009.

United States milk production, for the first 6 months, rose 0.3 percent from the same period in 2008 when adjusted for leap year; however, actual volume declined 195 million pounds. A map illustrated U.S. milk production, year-to-year percent change, for January through June, 2008 and 2009.

August

The effect of the temporary increases in Cheddar cheese and nonfat dry milk support prices through the Dairy Product Price Support Program were discussed. Charts illustrated the National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS) and CME block Cheddar and nonfat dry milk prices for 2009 compared to the support prices.

The Northeast uniform price for August 2009 continued to be under \$12.50 per hundredweight for a seventh month in a row, making September the eighth month for MILC payments. A chart illustrated the uniform price versus the uniform price plus MILC payment, along with a table showing actual and estimated milk and feed prices for January through September 2009.

Milk movements from the Northeast Order to other orders were summarized and accompanied by a table showing bulk milk shipments and receipts from other federal orders for the month of August during the past 6 years.

September

USDA issued a recommended decision to adopt amendments to the producer-handler definition in all federal milk marketing orders.

Total stocks, both commercial and government, reached 14.5 billion pounds in July 2009, their highest level since August 1993. Accompanying tables showed total stocks on a milk equivalent-milkfat basis, total natural cheese stocks, and total nonfat dry milk stocks since January 2007.

The Commodity Credit Corporation (CCC) made their first purchases of nonfortified nonfat dry milk and butter since MY'06. These were the largest total purchases on a milk equivalent basis since MY'04. Accompanying

charts illustrated CCC purchases of dairy products under the support program for 1989 through 2009 and an example of how the milk equivalent is calculated.

A pool summary for all federal orders was given in a table for January–September, 2008 and 2009.

October

The temporary increase in the amount for dairy products through the Dairy Product Price Support Program operated by the CCC ended. The effect of the increase on commodity prices was discussed and accompanied by charts showing the nonfat dry milk and block Cheddar cheese prices for NASS vs. CME for January through October 2009.

An explanation was given on the meaning of the mailbox price calculated every month using producer payroll data in the Northeast Order. Tables illustrated the average producer price differential (PPD) by mailbox region; the percent of milk produced that was received by differential zone, for July 2008 and June 2009; and Northeast Order regions' average hauling costs and premiums in 2009.

November

The 2009 Northeast Regional Dairy Outlook Conference was held on November 20 at the Northeast Order's Albany office. A table showed the statistical uniform prices for 2008, the actual and estimated prices for 2009, and the estimated prices for 2010.

Total producer receipts in the Northeast Order declined by 0.9 percent in the first 9 months of 2009. The utilization trends for the past four years during the first 9 months in the Northeast Order were discussed briefly and accompanied by a table showing Northeast Order utilization for selected products for January through September, 2006 through 2009.

A calendar showed the 2010 dates for partial payments to producers who are not members of cooperatives. The Order requirement was explained.

December

The block and barrel Cheddar price spread, which characterized the CME spot market and NASS prices, returned to normal. Discussion on the impact of the spread on federal order prices, along with price movement, was explained briefly and accompanied by a chart showing the CME block and barrel Cheddar prices from January 2009 through January 2010.

Selected Northeast Order statistics for 2009 were summarized and a table compared the Order's pool statistics for 2008 and 2009.

A pool summary for all federal orders was given in a table for January–December, 2008 and 2009.
