

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## Summary

This bulletin provides information about the operation of the Northeast Order during 2020 through a series of tables and charts. The *Bulletin Highlights* section summarizes important events that impacted the dairy industry in 2020. Also included are lists of handlers and cooperatives operating under the Order with their respective locations depicted on a map of the region.

### **Order Volume Increases**

Total milk received from producers equaled 26.8 billion pounds in 2020, up a slight 0.3 percent from 2019; it is flat when adjusted for leap year. Comparisons have not been adjusted for the significant volume of milk not included in the pool (depooling). The annual average volume per producer grew 567 pounds from the previous year and topped 8,000 pounds for the first time ever under the Order. The year ended with 8,954 producers, a drop of 527 from December 2019.

### **Class Utilization Changes**

Class I utilization averaged 30.6 percent in 2020, down 0.4 percentage points from 2019. The volume of milk used for Class I purposes declined 72.5 million pounds (0.9 percent) from the previous year; this is considerably less than the 417.7 million pound decline in 2019. The total volume of producer receipts used in Class II increased a slight 0.1 percent from 2019. The Class II utilization percentage was unchanged from 2019 at 23.9 percent of total producer milk pooled in 2020. Class III volume decreased 3.1 percent and utilization averaged 25.9 percent, down 0.9 percentage points from 2019. This decline was the result of a large volume of milk not pooled in June 2020. The amount of milk used in Class IV rose 7.3 percent and accounted for an annual average of 19.6 percent utilization, an increase of 1.3 percentage points. Total Class IV volume was the highest ever since the Order's inception.

### **Prices Lower Than 2019**

As previously mentioned, milk supplies were sufficient during 2020, but the Covid-19 crisis caused issues with supply chains and curbed demand in certain areas and products. Efforts by the federal government to keep food programs operational and the addition of extra food programs kept prices from falling further during the summer months.

*Commodity Prices* - National Dairy Product Sales Report (NDPSR) butter prices were down 30 percent

from 2019, averaging \$1.5808 per pound. NDPSR cheese prices began falling the first quarter of 2020 but after the federal food programs kicked in, jumped to set record high block and barrel prices in July. The combined cheese price averaged \$1.9236 per pound in 2020, up 9.4 percent from 2019. The NDPSR nonfat dry milk price was basically unchanged from 2019, averaging \$1.0417 per pound compared to \$1.0419 the previous year. Dry whey prices were down 4.7 percent from the previous year, averaging \$0.3621 per pound.

*Component Prices* - All component price averages were below the previous year except protein. The price paid to producers for butterfat averaged \$1.7067 per pound, down 32 percent from 2019, and the lowest price since 2013. The per-pound annual average protein price was \$3.7559 per pound, up 57.8 percent from the previous year's average and the third highest since the Order's inception in 2000. The other solids price averaged \$0.1678 per pound, a decrease of 9.9 percent from 2019. The nonfat solids price averaged \$0.8651 per pound, basically unchanged from the previous year's \$0.8654.

*Class Prices* - Product price changes translated into lower class prices for all classes except Class III. The Class I price averaged \$20.16 per hundredweight in 2020, down 0.4 percent from the 2019 annual average. The Class II price averaged \$14.29 per hundredweight, a decrease of 14.7 percent from the previous year. The Class III price averaged \$18.16, up 7.0 percent from 2019. The Class IV price averaged \$13.49, a drop of 17.2 percent. Overall, the statistical uniform price (blend) reported at Suffolk County, Massachusetts (Boston) had a simple average of \$17.10 per hundredweight, 5.6 percent below the 2019 average. For the first time ever under the Order, the annual average PPD was negative.

### **Producer Tests**


The annual average producer butterfat test equaled 3.92 percent in 2020, an increase of 0.02 percentage points from 2019. There were record highs set during 9 months of 2020 and a new Order high set in December at 4.08 percent. The annual average producer protein test was 3.11 percent, up 0.01 percentage point from the previous year. Record highs were set in 6 months of 2020. The producer other solids test averaged 5.77 percent, up 0.01 percentage point over 2019. Record-highs were set in 8 months of the year. All producer component tests set new Order record-high annual averages in 2020.












### Contribution by Components to Statistical Uniform Price, 2016–2020













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



## Bulletin Highlights — 2020

### **January**

Producer component tests were compared for the five states that contribute the largest volumes to the Northeast Order at pool time for the month of October from 2010 through 2019. Accompanying charts illustrated producer butterfat, protein, and other solids component tests for the month of October, 2010–2019.

A summary of the 2019 market service program was discussed. An overview of the calibration program was given, as were the results of tank checks/calibrations. A chart illustrated tank checks and calibrations by tank size for 2019. A table announced the tentative calibration truck schedule for 2020.

### **February**

Milk production, cow numbers and production per cow were compared for the U.S. and Northeast milkshed for 2019 vs 2018. A table showed selected statistics for the top ten states ranked by 2019 milk production.

Average component tests between Northeast Order cooperative members and non-member producers were compared and discussed. Charts displayed member versus non-member butterfat and protein tests and cooperative share of producers for the month of October, 2010–2019.

### **March**

Changes in rankings and the proportion of farms and daily deliveries per producer (DDP) in the top ten Northeast Order counties in 2019 were discussed. A map depicted the top ten counties: their rank and percent change in pounds, farm numbers, and DDP from 2018 to 2019. A table showed milk production, number of farms, and average DDP in the top ten counties pooling on the Order for 2019.

A discussion was held on the COVID-19 pandemic related impacts on Northeast Order class and component prices. A chart illustrated National Dairy Product Sales Report (NDPSR) weekly prices used in determining those prices from September 2019 through April 2020.

Pool data for all federal orders were summarized in a table for January–March, 2019 and 2020.

### **April**

The USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS) released their *Dairy Products 2019*

*Summary.* Changes in national cheese production and other selected products, top manufacturing states, and percent of total milk production were discussed. A table highlighted selected products' changes from 2018 and 2014 to 2019, and a comparison of Northeast Order milk used in the manufacture of these products.

USDA announced the Coronavirus Food Assistance Program (CFAP) that was developed in response to the COVID-19 national emergency to provide support to farmers and ranchers, maintain the integrity of the food supply chain, and ensure that Americans continue to received and have access to the food needed. Other USDA initiatives also were discussed.

Changes in NDPSR weekly prices that affected the Northeast Order class and component prices during the COVID-19 pandemic and resulted in shocks to demand and supply were discussed. A chart illustrated weekly NDPSR prices used in determining those prices from September 2019 through May 2020.

### **May**

The results of the November 2019 biennial container sales survey for the Northeast Milk Marketing Area were reported. A table compared packaged fluid milk products by method of distribution in 2019 to 2017. A chart illustrated sales by container size for November 2019.

An update was given on how product prices have been affected by the COVID-19 pandemic. One chart illustrated NDPSR weekly prices used in determining those prices from September 2019 through June 2020. Another chart showed monthly component prices derived from the weekly NDPSR prices from October 2019 through May 2020.

### **June**

In the seven Federal Milk Marketing Orders (FMMOs) that pay producers based on milk components plus a PPD value, the June PPD reached new lows in most of the FMMOs and was significantly negative. An explanation was given of how record price increases factored into June's negative PPDs in the federal order system. The factors behind the negative PPD were explained. A chart showed Chicago Mercantile Exchange (CME) weekly price averages for January 3

through July 10, 2020. How the negative PPD is computed was illustrated.

### **July**

A market situation update reported on the continuation of challenges and uncertainty the industry faced during the COVID-19 pandemic. Highlights included how dairy product and milk prices have responded to supply and demand. An overview of negative PPDs and the return of depooled milk were discussed. Charts illustrated NDPSR weekly and monthly component prices from November 2019 through July 2020.

An update was given on USDA's Milk Donation Reimbursement Program. USDA announced applications are being accepted for participation in the program for the fiscal year 2021, through March, 31, 2021.

Pool data for all federal orders were summarized in a table for January–June, 2019 and 2020.

### **August**

Milk production for the U.S. and Northeast milkshed for the first 6 months of 2020 was compared to the same time period in 2019. Northeast Order pool volume was discussed. A table showed the top ten states ranked by milk production and selected areas for 2019 vs 2020. A map illustrated the year-to-year percent change in milk production for the NASS 24 major states for January through June 2020.

The Northeast Order's August statistical uniform price (SUP) declined about a dollar per hundredweight (cwt) below July's high for the year. A discussion on the current market situation was held. Charts displayed the NDPSR weekly prices and the Northeast Order SUP and class prices from December 2019 through August 2020.

### **September**

Total milk receipts pooled on the Northeast Order for the January through September 2020 period were 1 percent below the same time period in 2019. An article discussed year-to-year comparisons of utilization by class. Percent changes in utilization of selected products were displayed in a table comparing 2020 to 2015, 2018, and 2019.

USDA announced they were enrolling dairy farmers for the 2021 Dairy Margin Coverage program through December 11, 2020. Program provisions and producer requirements were discussed.

Pool data for all federal orders were summarized in a table for January–September, 2019 and 2020.

### **October**

A market situation update was given on CME prices that indicated a decline in NDPSR prices as continued challenges and uncertainty faced the industry during the COVID-19 pandemic. NASS stocks of butter, cheese, and nonfat dry milk were compared from 2017 through 2020. Charts illustrated NDPSR weekly and U.S. butter, cheese, and nonfat dry milk stock prices.

Milk received at Northeast Order plants at the \$3.25 base zone (Boston, MA, and surrounding areas) in October 2020 accounted for 2.4 percent, down from 4.5 percent 5 years earlier. A discussion on milk received by differential zone and class was held. A table compared pooled milk receipts from producers by class and plant differential zone at which priced for the month of October for 2020 vs 2015.

### **November**

The Northeast SUP was forecast to finish the year 2020 below the previous year. Demand and supply factors were analyzed for 2020 and predicted for 2021. A chart displayed actual and estimated SUP compared to corn, soybean, and diesel prices for 2016 through projected 2021.

A schedule showed the 2021 dates for partial payments to producers who are not members of cooperatives. The Order requirement was explained.

### **December**

Northeast Order's total milk received from producers in 2020 increased slightly from 2019. Selected Northeast Order statistics for 2020 were summarized, and a table compared the Order's pool statistics for 2019 and 2020. A chart illustrated the class utilization of milk pooled on the Order for 2020.

Pool data for all federal orders were summarized in a table for January–December, 2019 and 2020.
