

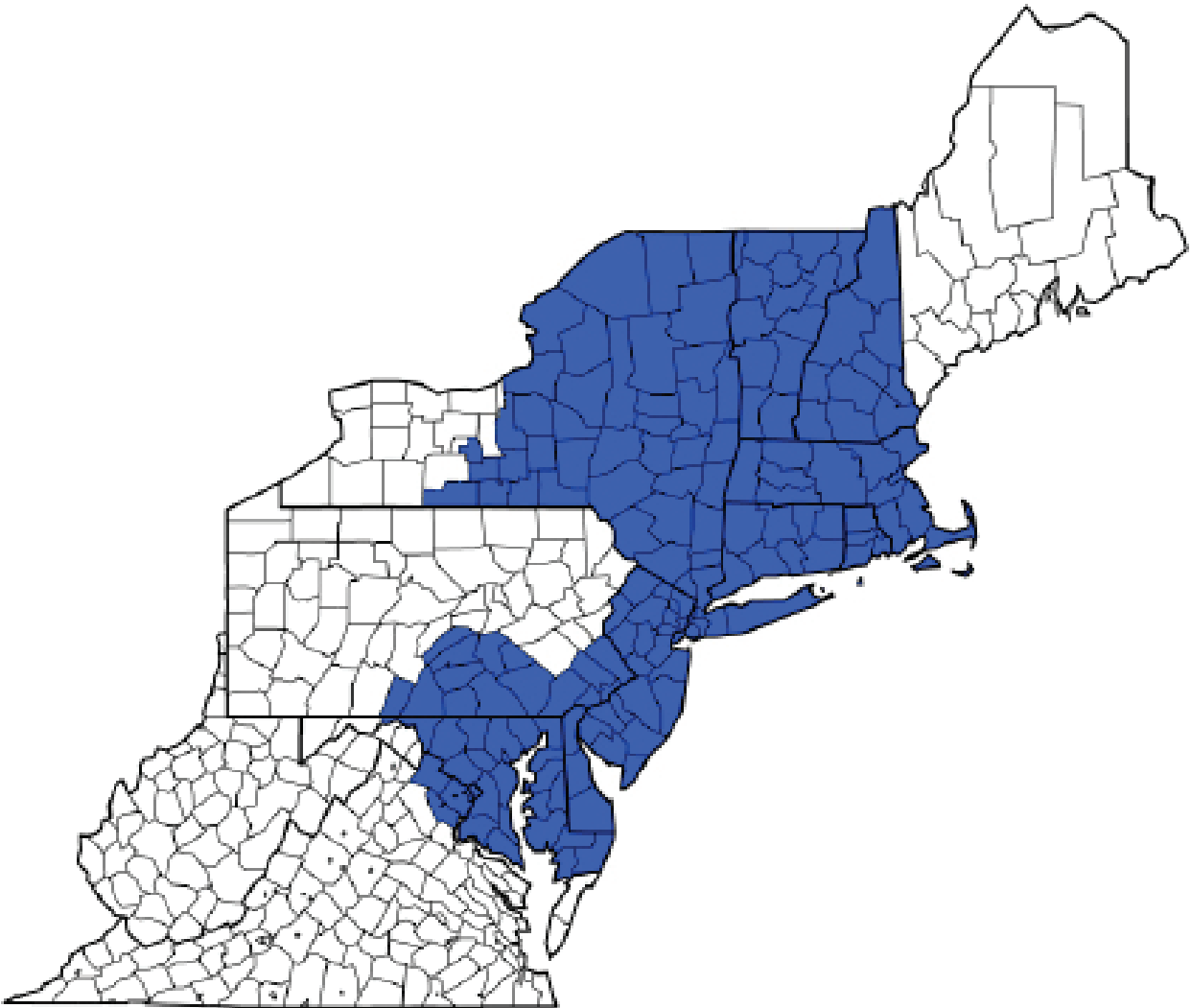
The Market Administrator's Annual Statistical Bulletin

Northeast Milk Marketing Area
Federal Order No. 1

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2024

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Summary

This bulletin provides information about the operation of the Northeast Order during 2024 through a series of tables and charts. The *Bulletin Highlights* section summarizes important events that impacted the dairy industry in 2024. Also included are lists of handlers and cooperatives operating under the Order with their respective locations depicted on a map of the region.

Order Volume Decreases

Total milk received from producers equaled 26.9 billion pounds in 2024, down 1.4 percent from 2023, adjusted for leap year. The annual average volume per producer continued to set record-highs, although at a slower rate than in the past 9 years and rose 180 pounds from the previous year, topping 10,000 pounds for 3 months during 2024. The year ended with 7,359 producers, a drop of 281 from December 2023; the decrease was 444 the previous year.

Class Utilization Changes

The volume of milk used for Class I purposes declined only 32 million pounds (0.7 percent) from the previous year, compared to a drop of 1.3 percent in 2023. All class volume comparisons have been adjusted for leap year. Class I utilization averaged 29.0 percent in 2024, up 0.2 percentage points from 2023. The total volume of producer receipts used in Class II dropped 108 million pounds (1.8 percent); it rose 8.5 percent in 2023 and set a record high in usage. Class II utilization averaged 25.4 percent, down 0.1 percentage point.

Class III volume set a record high, increasing 3.6 percent and surpassed the record set in 2023 by 306 million pounds; utilization averaged 30.7 percent, up 1.5 percentage points from 2023. The category that includes Swiss and other hard varieties of cheese again had the most growth, followed by cream cheese. Even though milk assigned to the lowest class price (shrinkage, dumped, animal feed, lost in transit) declined, the Class III price was the lowest for all but two months of 2024. The amount of milk used in Class IV decreased 10.9 percent and accounted for an annual average of 14.9 percent utilization, a decrease of 1.6 percentage points. A significant decrease occurred in milk utilized in dried milk products, which is largely used to make nonfat dry milk.

Prices Higher Than in 2023

Even though milk production was stagnant to declining, the demand for dairy products was steady to increasing. This resulted in higher prices than in 2023, although not as high as in 2022. Exports were down 0.4 percent in 2024, compared to a decline of 7 percent in 2023.

Commodity Prices—National Dairy Product Sales Report (NDPSR) butter prices rose 10.3 percent from 2023 and averaged \$2.8870 per pound, the highest on record since federal order reform in 2000. NDPSR cheese prices averaged \$1.8634 per pound, an increase of 5.9 percent with combined averages of \$1.8247 for blocks and \$1.8658 for barrels, increases of 0.5 and 11.06 percent, respectively.

The NDPSR nonfat dry milk price increased 4.8 percent from 2023, averaging \$1.2420 per pound. Dry whey prices jumped 35.8 percent from the previous year and averaged \$0.4913 per pound.

Component Prices—All component price averages were above the previous year except protein. The price paid to producers for butterfat averaged \$3.2885 per pound, up 11.0 percent from 2023 and the highest price since federal order reform. The annual average protein price was \$1.8961 per pound, down 0.5 percent from the previous year's average. The other solids price averaged \$0.3010 per pound, a jump of 79.6 percent from 2023. The nonfat solids price averaged \$1.0635 per pound, an increase of 5.5 percent from the previous year.

Class Prices—Annual average class prices were considerably higher than in 2023 for all classes except Class I, which declined 3.6 percent and averaged \$21.45 per hundredweight. The Class II price averaged \$21.34 per hundredweight, an increase of 6.2 percent from the previous year. The Class III price averaged \$18.89, a jump of 11.0 percent from 2023. The Class IV price averaged \$20.75, up 8.5 percent. Overall, the statistical uniform price (blend) reported at Suffolk County, Massachusetts (Boston) averaged \$21.44 per hundredweight, 7.2 percent above the 2023 average. The producer price differential (PPD) averaged \$2.55 per hundredweight (at Boston) for the year, 44 cents below the 2023 average.

Producer Tests

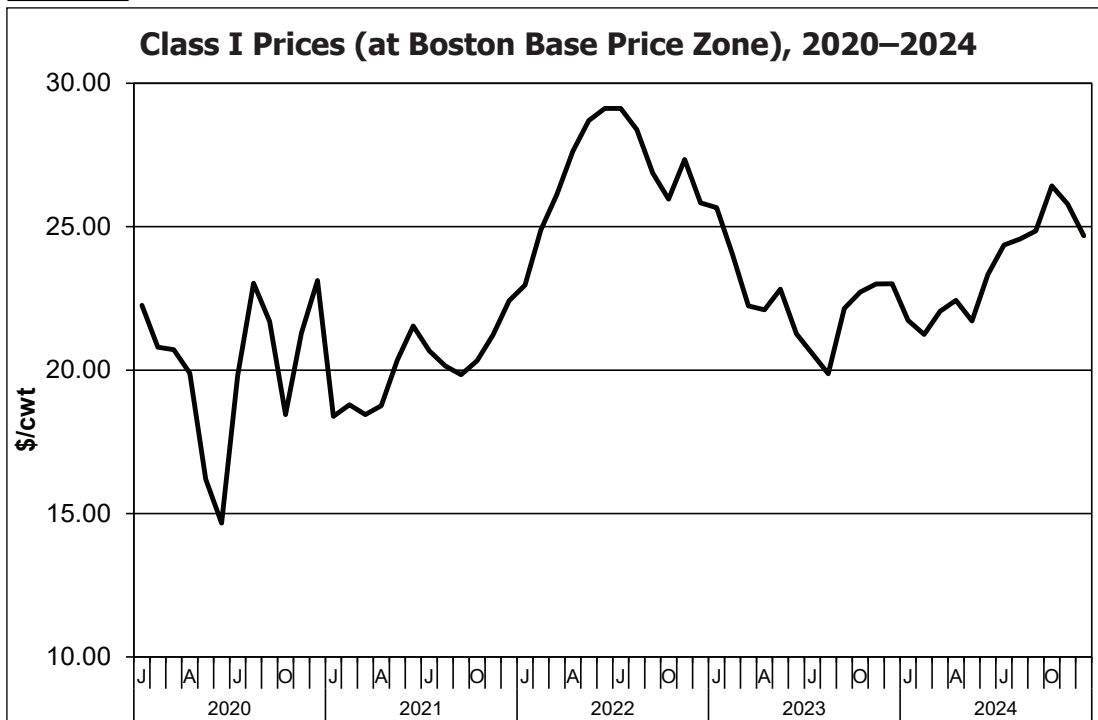
The annual average producer butterfat test equaled 4.22 percent in 2024, a jump of 0.10 percentage points from 2023. Monthly record-highs were set each month and ranged from 0.06 to 0.16 percentage points above the previous monthly record. A new Order high was set in December at 4.43 percent. The annual average producer protein test was 3.21 percent, up 0.03 percentage points from the previous year. Monthly record-highs were set in 10 months of 2024 and a new Order high was set in December at 3.33 percent. The producer other solids test averaged 5.78 percent, an increase of 0.01 percentage point. The year's record high was 5.79 percent, which matched multiple occurrences in prior years.

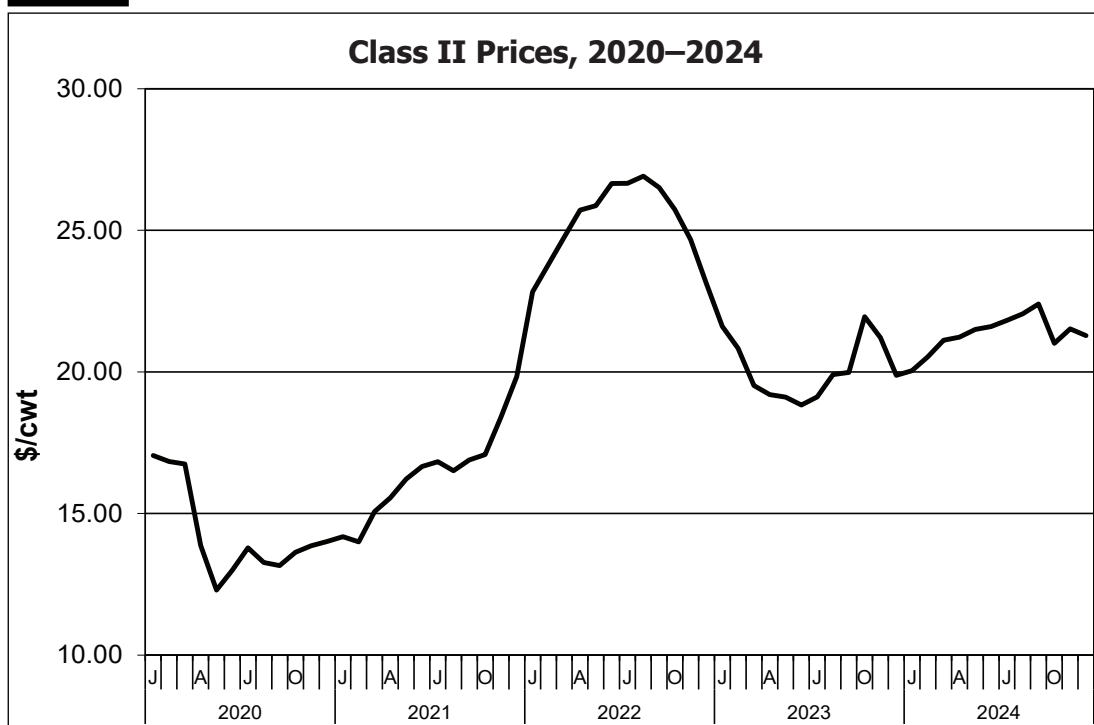

2 Class II Prices, 2020–2024

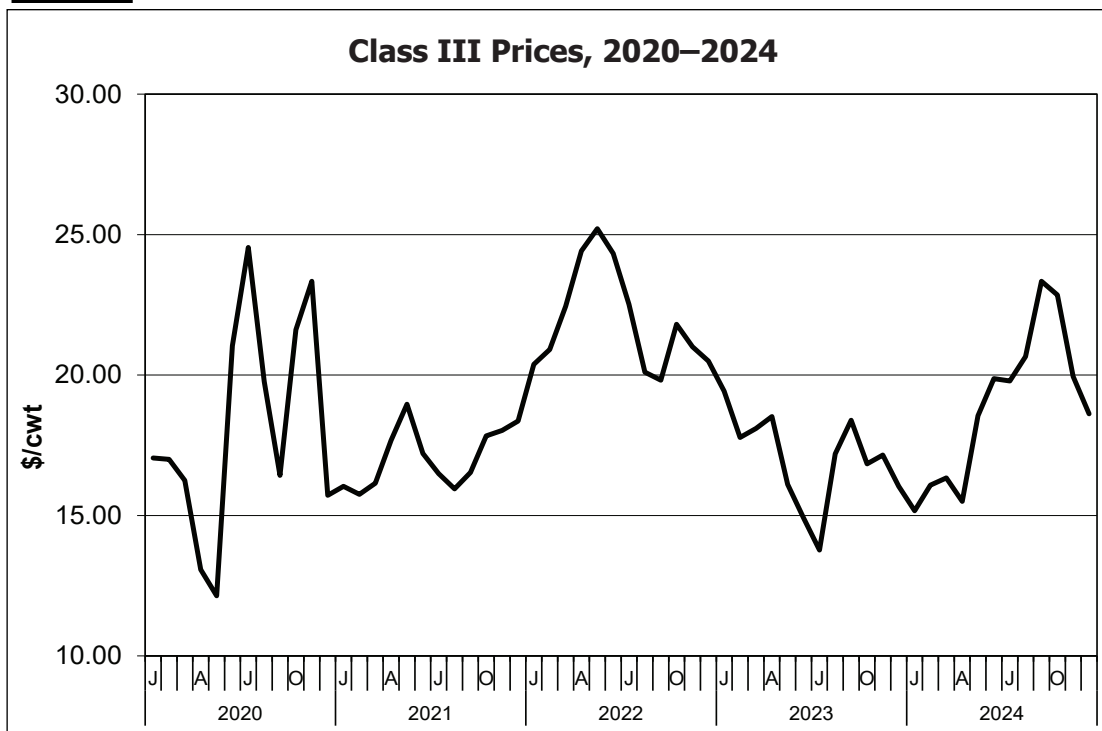

3 Class III Prices, 2020–2024

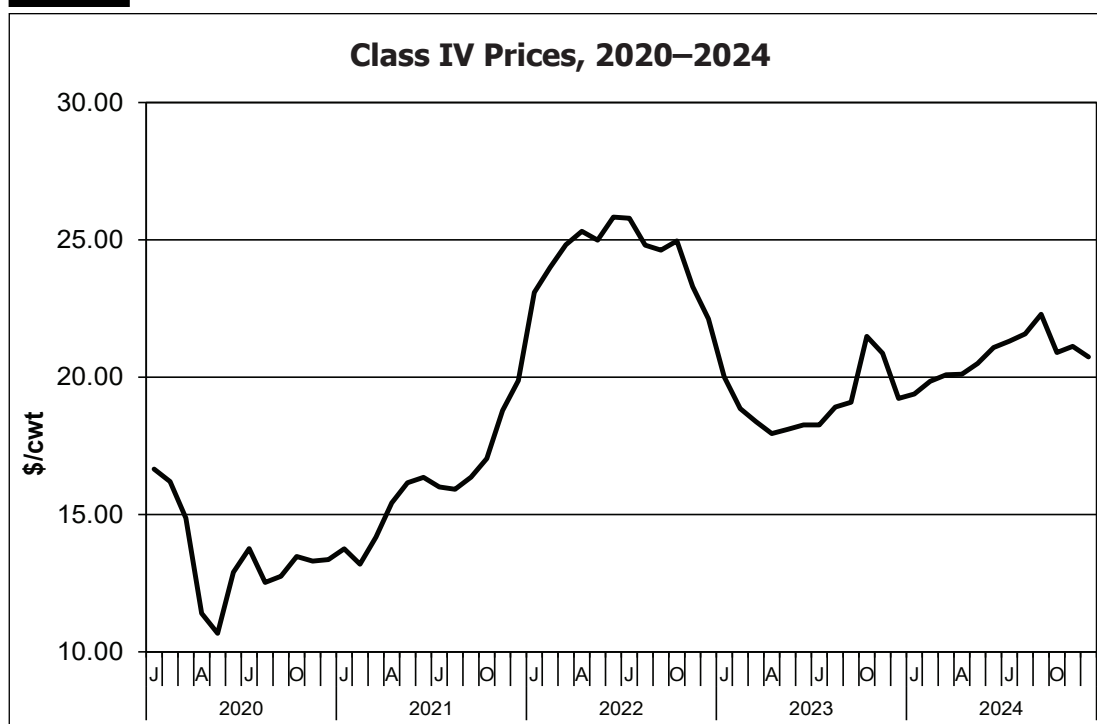

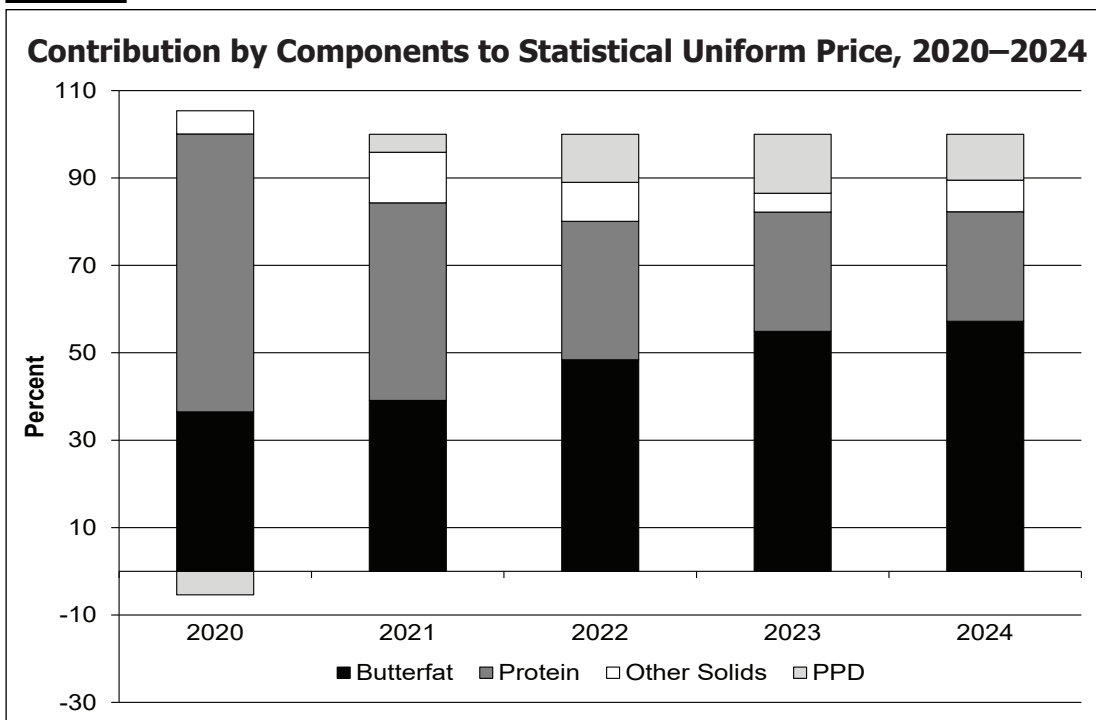
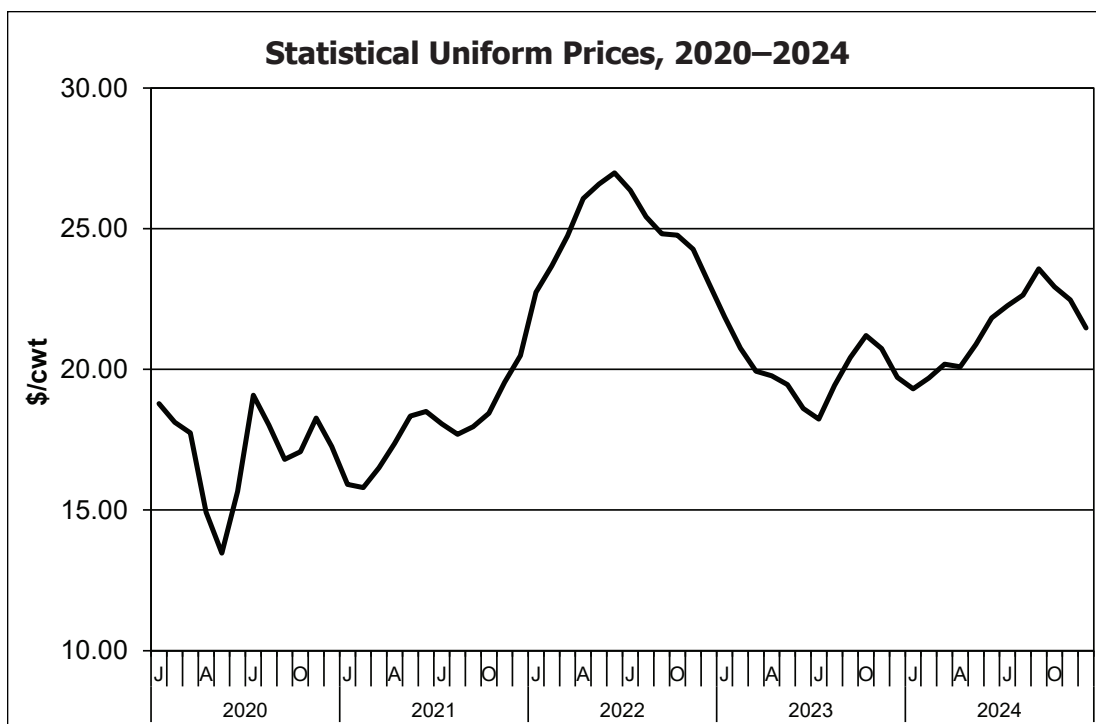
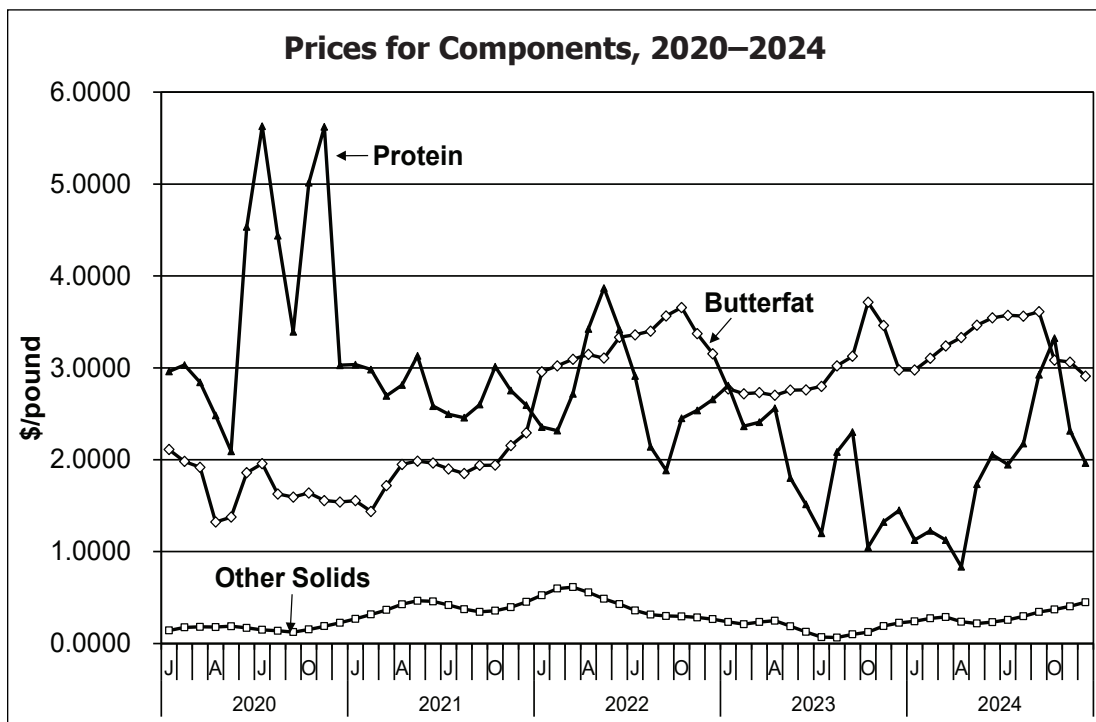


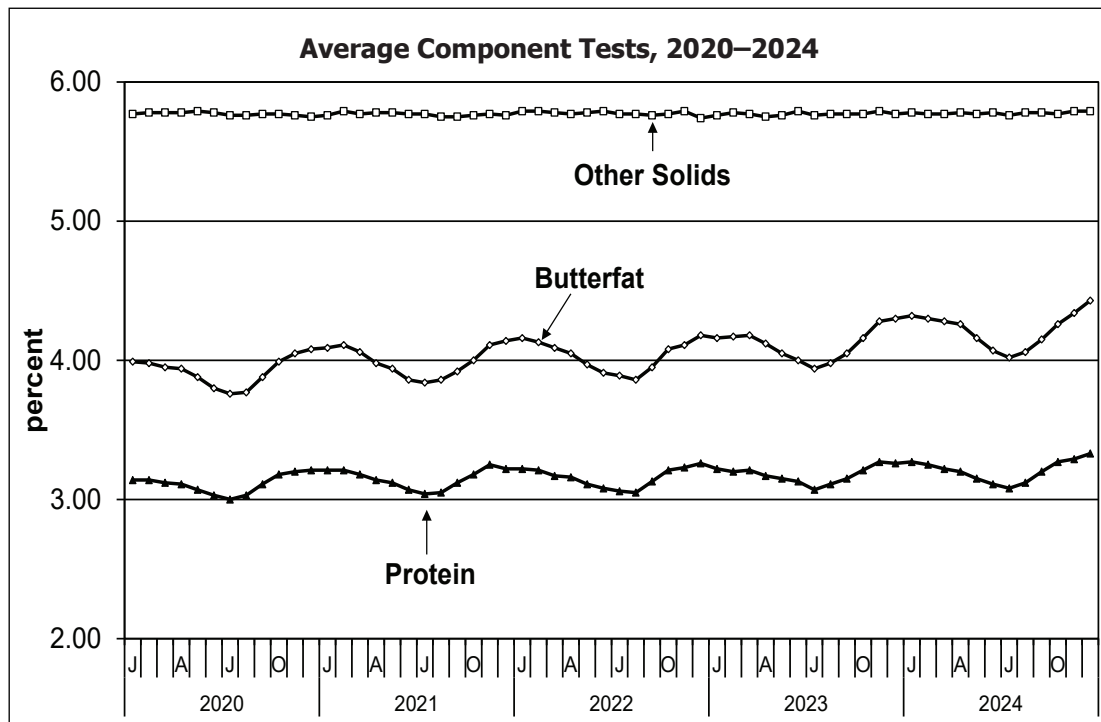
Figure 6**Figure 7**

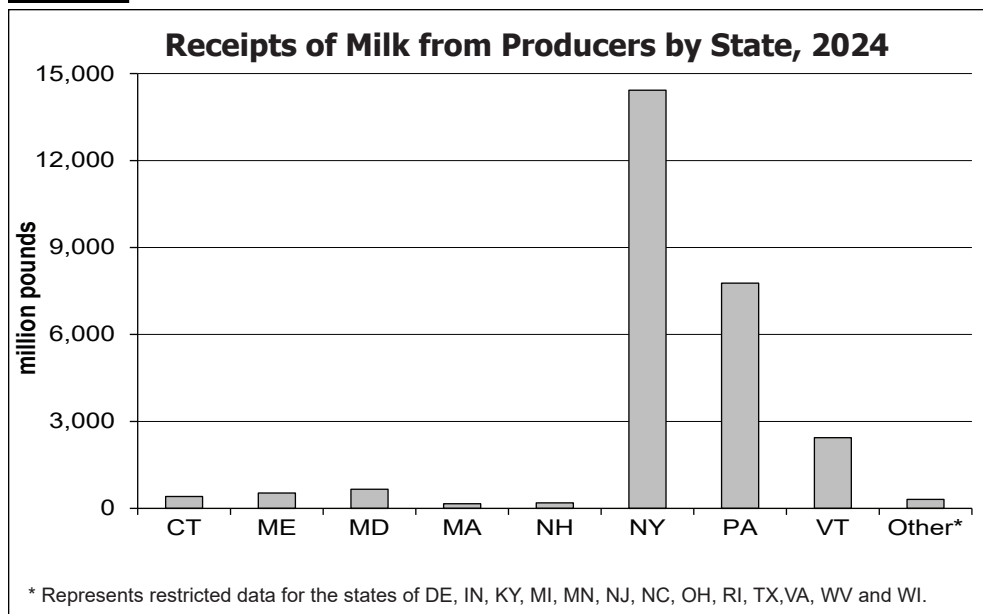

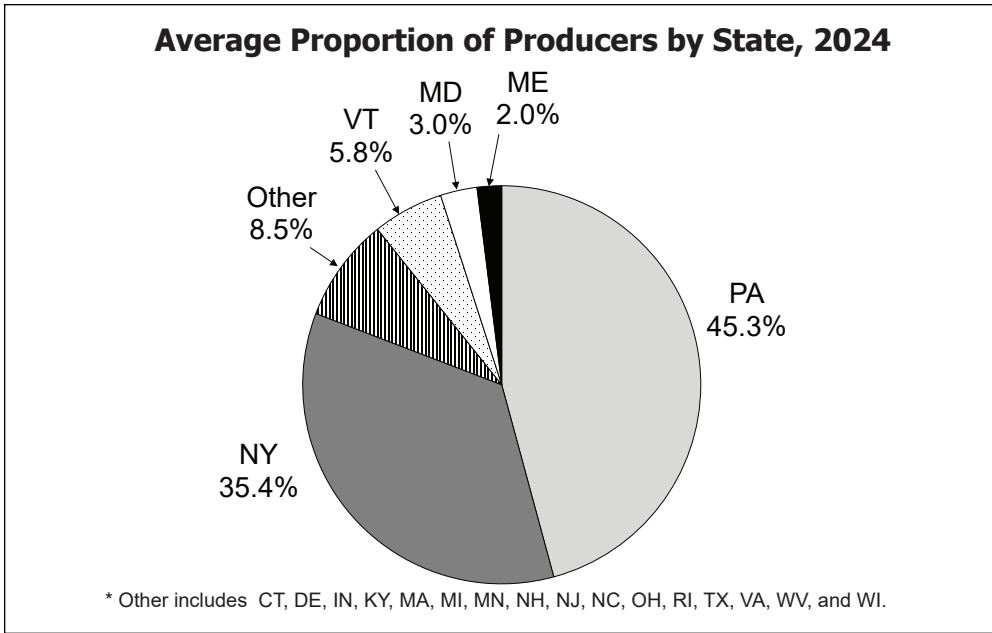

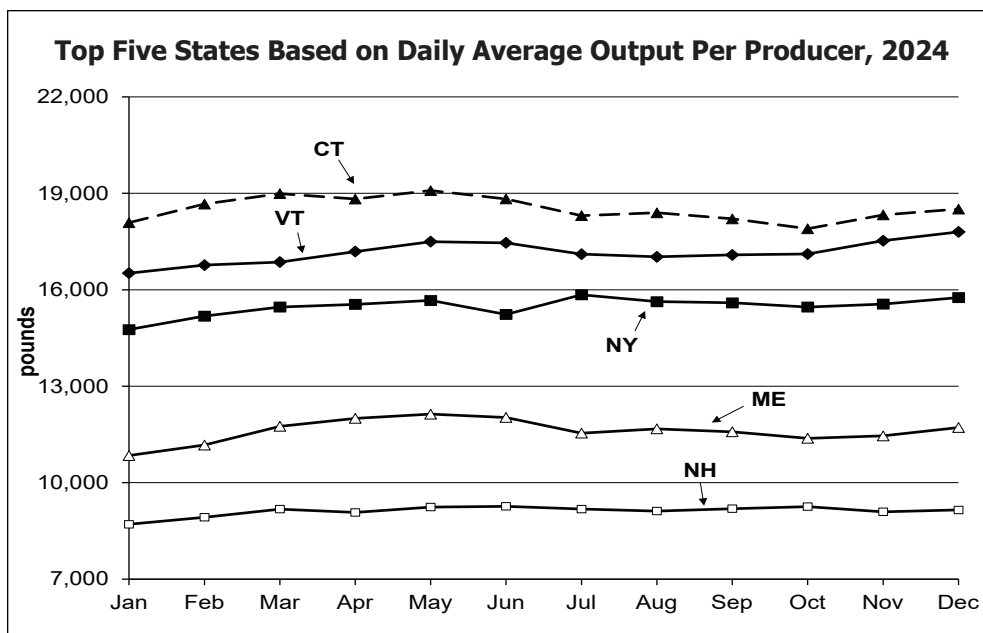

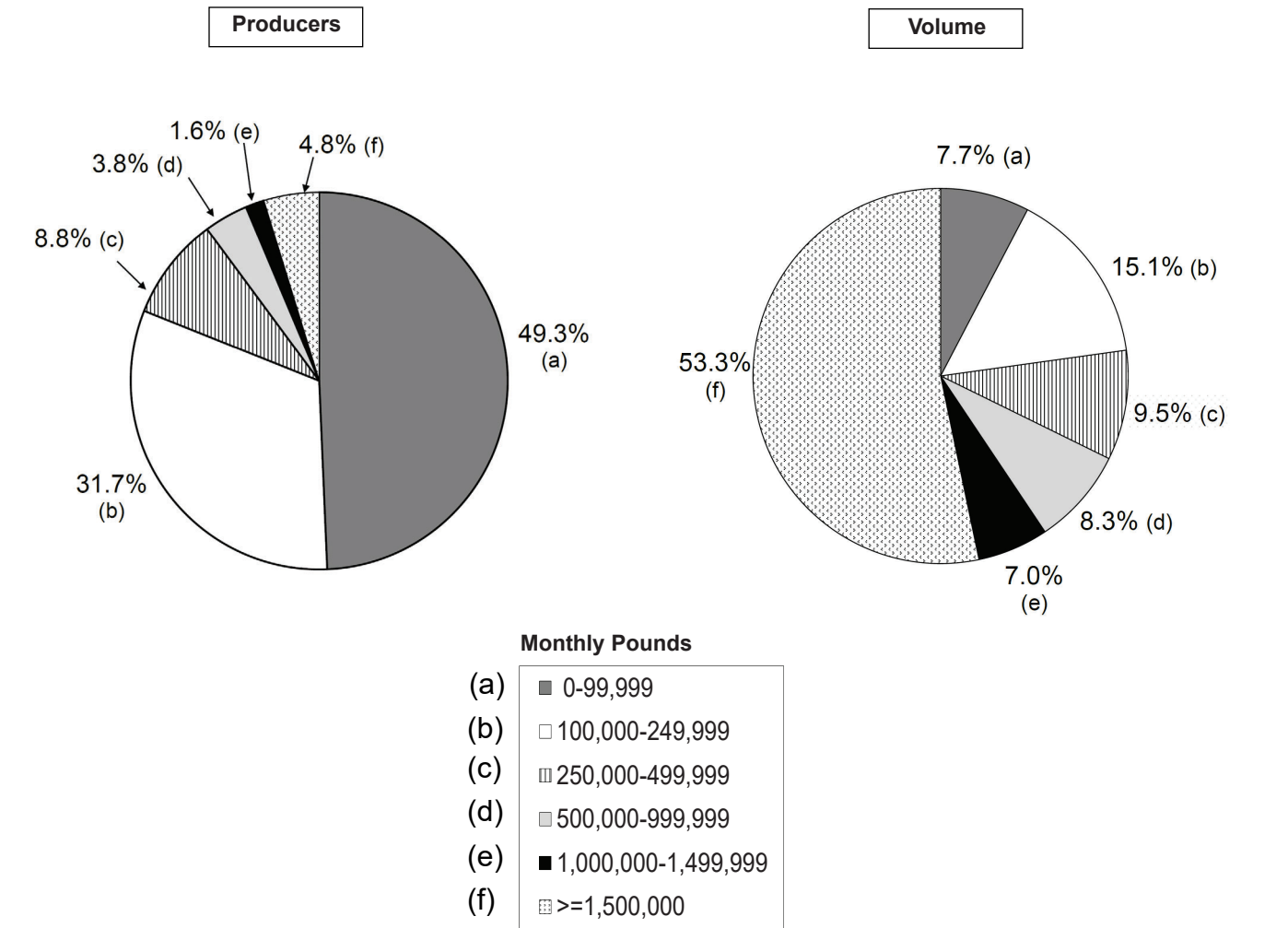

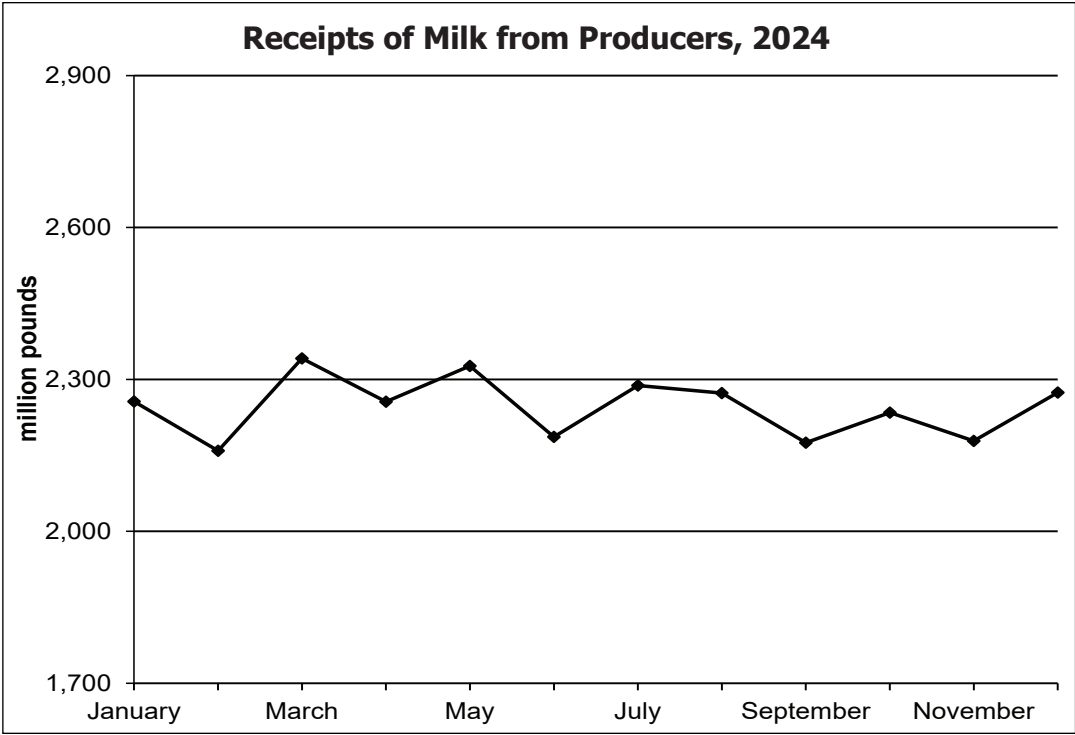
Percentage of Producers and Volume by Size Categories, December 2024

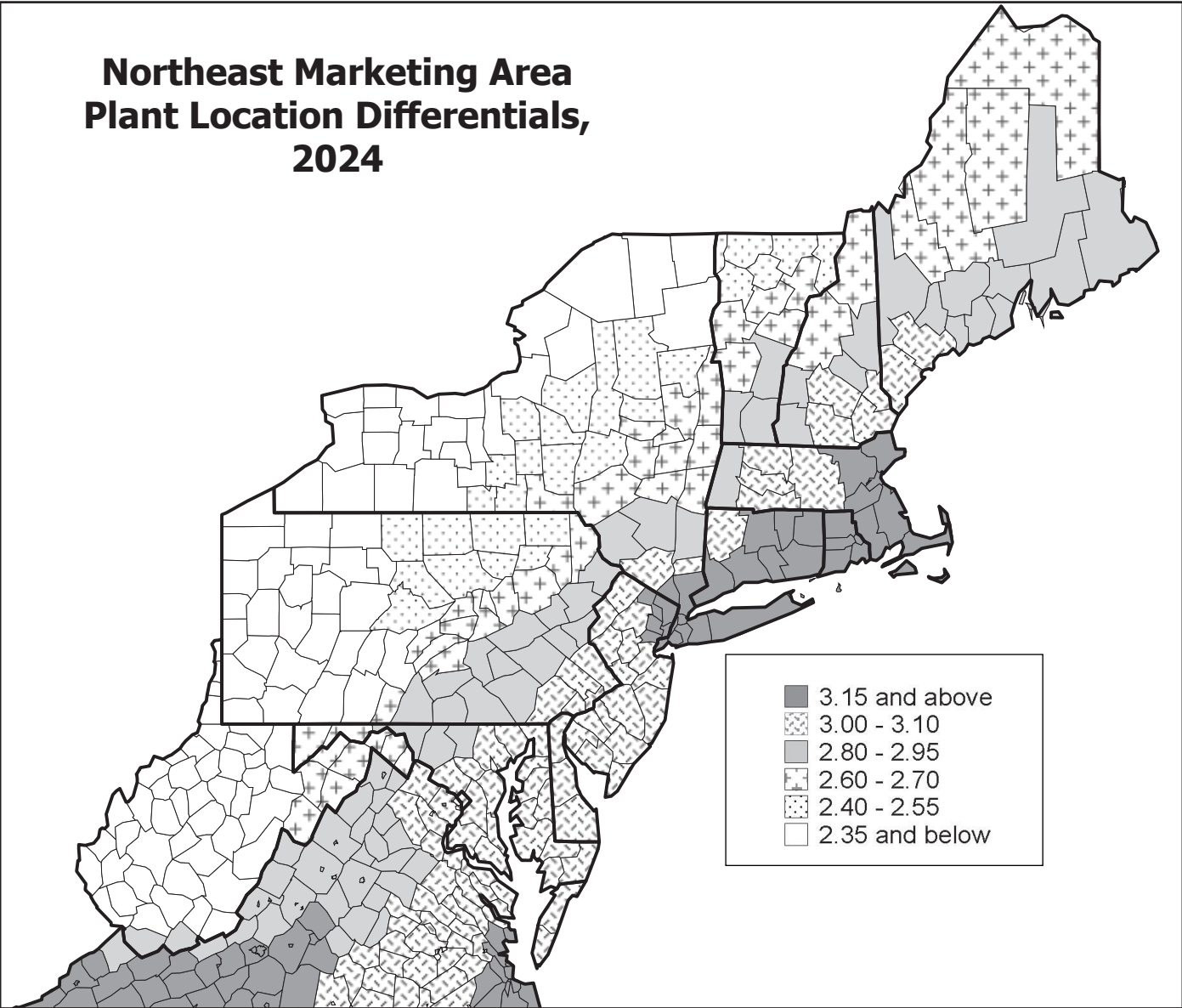

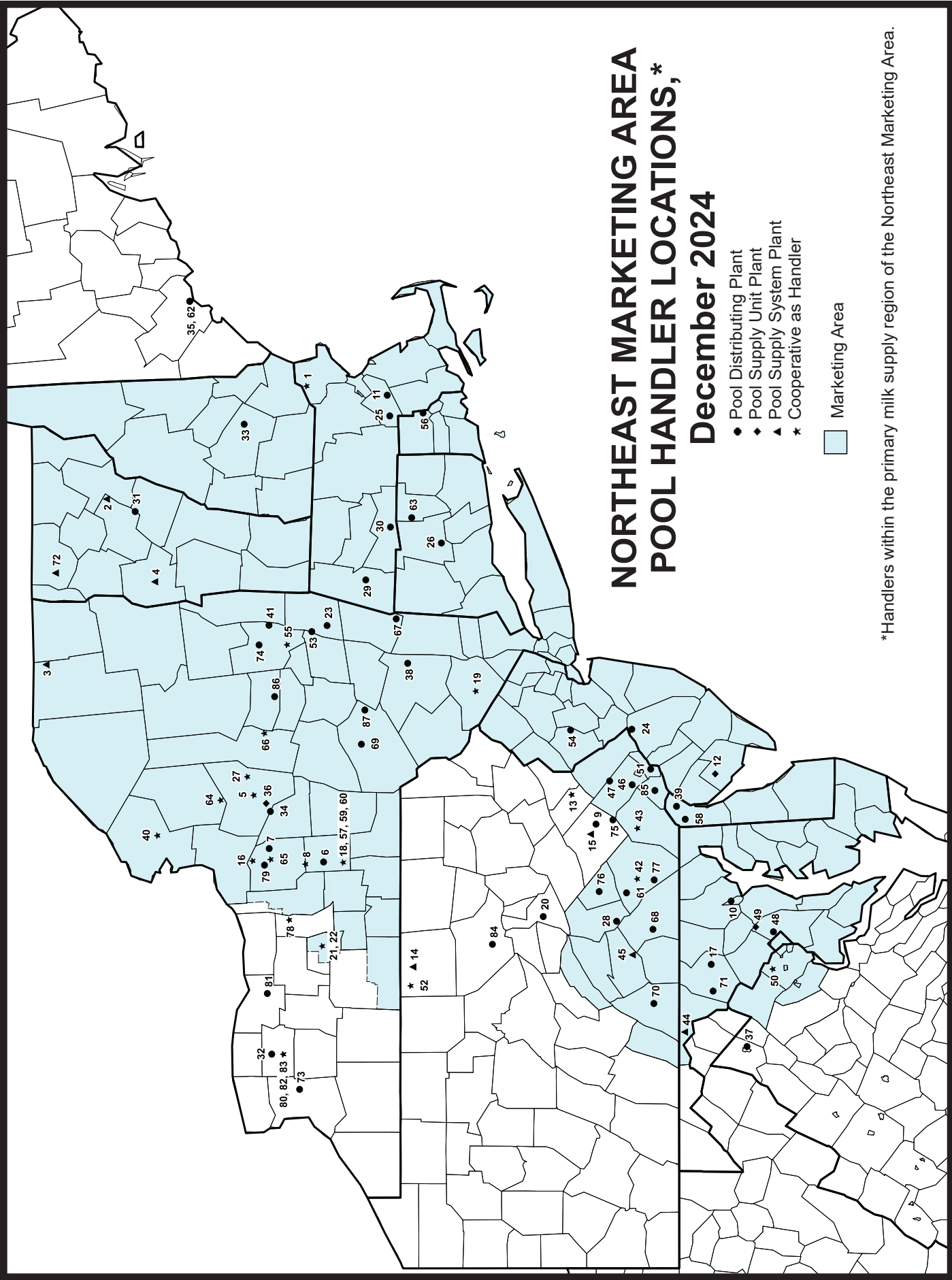

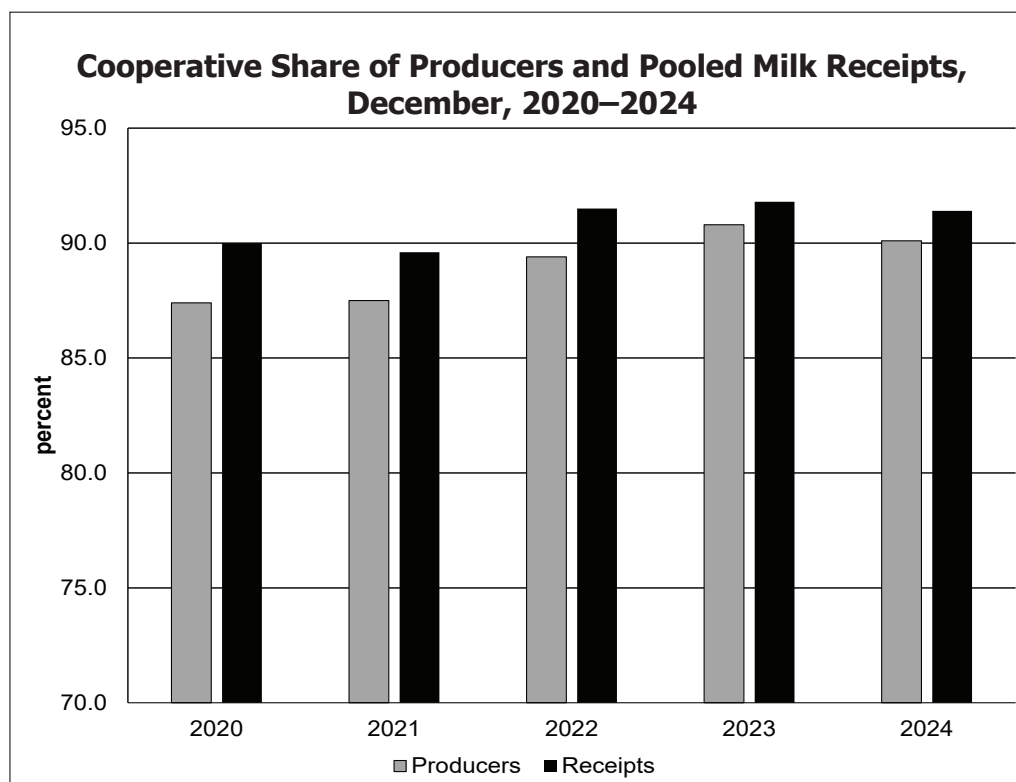

Bulletin Highlights — 2024

January

For 2023, the statistical uniform price (SUP) averaged \$20.01 per hundredweight (cwt) with an average producer price differential (PPD) of \$2.99 per cwt. A market update was given, discussing feed and diesel prices, and dairy exports. A chart illustrated feed prices, diesel, and the SUP for January 2021 through January 2024 including projections for February through December 2024. A table showed estimated prices using CME futures for February through December 2024.

The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) issued a final rule that amended the transportation credit balancing fund provisions in the Appalachian and Southeast federal milk marketing orders (FMMOs) and established distributing plant delivery credits in the Appalachian, Florida, and Southeast FMMOs.

February

U.S. total milk production was relatively unchanged in 2023, decreasing around 52 million pounds; for comparison, in 2022 production increased 123 million pounds. Milk production, cow numbers, and production per cow were compared for the U.S. and Northeast milkshed for 2023 vs 2022. A table showed selected statistics for the top ten states ranked by 2023 milk production.

The 2023 market service program was summarized. An overview of the calibration program was given, as were the results of tank checks/calibrations. A chart illustrated tank checks and calibrations by tank size for 2023.

March

The results of the November 2023 biennial container sales survey for the Northeast Milk Marketing Area (NMA) were reported. A chart illustrated sales by container size for November 2023. Tables compared packaged fluid milk products by method of distribution in 2023 to 2021, and sales by container size in 2019, 2021 and 2023.

Pool data for all federal orders was summarized in a table for January–March, 2023 and 2024.

April

The United States Department of Agriculture's (USDA) National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS) released their *Dairy Products 2023 Summary*.

Changes in national cheese production and other selected products, top manufacturing states, and percent of total milk production were discussed. A table highlighted selected products' changes from 2022 and 2018 to 2023, and a comparison of Northeast Order milk used in the manufacture of these products.

The protein price for April 2024 was \$0.8345 per pound, the lowest since order formation and the first time since November 2000 the protein price has fallen below a dollar. A discussion was held on how the protein price is calculated and utilized. Overviews of trends in butterfat and cheese prices were given.

May

Changes in rankings and the proportion of farms and daily deliveries per producer (DDP) in the top ten Northeast Order counties in 2023 were discussed. A map depicted the top ten counties: their rank and percent change in pounds, farm numbers, and DDP from 2022 to 2023. A table showed milk production, number of farms, and average DDP in the top ten counties pooling on the Order for 2023.

April 2024 had the fourth highest PPD (\$4.59 per cwt) in the Northeast since Order formation in 2000. A discussion was held on the relationship between the Class III price and PPDs. A chart illustrated Class III price versus PPD for January 2020 through May 2024.

June

Milk production in the U.S. for the first 6 months of 2024 was compared to the same period in 2023. A table showed the top ten states ranked by milk production and selected areas for 2023 vs 2024. A map illustrated the year-to-year percent change in milk production for the NASS 24 major states for January through June 2024. Northeast Order pool volume was discussed.

USDA announced the Recommended Decision to amend the pricing provisions in the 11 FMMOs was published in the Federal Register. The Recommended Decision followed a 49-day national hearing held from August 23, 2023, through January 30, 2024. It puts forth a package of amendments to update formulas and factors based on the evidentiary record of the proceeding.

Pool data for all federal orders was summarized in a table for January–June, 2023 and 2024.

July

From January to July 2024, the SUP averaged \$20.61 per cwt with an average PPD of \$3.28 per cwt.

Bulletin Highlights — 2024 (*continued*)

A market update was given, discussing feed and diesel prices, and dairy exports. A chart illustrated feed prices, diesel, and the SUP for January 2023 through December 2024 including projections for August through December 2024.

The Market Administrator approved lowering the shipping percentage for September through November for 2024. An explanation of a request and decision on lowering the percentage of milk that pool supply plants and cooperative Section 1000.9(c) handlers must deliver to Class I pool distributing plants for the months of September, October, and November for the Northeast Order was given.

August

NMA sales of fluid packaged milk continued a downward trend. Trends of packaged fluid milk sales, sales by product, and per capita sales were discussed. A table displayed sales in the NMA from 2018 through 2023, along with estimated changes for January through June, 2023 to 2024. A table compared total per capita sales in the NMA vs the U.S. from 2018 through 2024.

Commodity prices and stocks were updated. An overview of the role storage of commodity products plays in smoothing out the supply and demand relationship was given. Charts displayed production of butter, cheese, nonfat dry milk, and whey prices versus stock volumes from January 2022 through July 2024.

September

The lowest PPD for 2024, at Suffolk County, MA, was \$0.23 per cwt for the month of September, 2024. An explanation on how the PPD is calculated was given. A table showed PPD by selected locations for September 2024. A chart illustrated component and PPD breakdown of SUP at test for April and September 2024.

An update on the status of the National FMMO Pricing Formula Hearing was given.

USDA has worked swiftly and diligently to assess the prevalence of highly pathogenic avian influenza H5N1 in U.S. dairy herds since the first detection in March 2024. The efforts to detect and reduce further spread was discussed.

Pool data for all federal orders was summarized in a table for January–September, 2023 and 2024.

October

USDA issued a final decision proposing to amend the uniform pricing formulas applicable in all 11 FMMOs. Following the publication of the final decision and before any changes take effect, Agriculture Marketing Services (AMS) will conduct producer referendums in each of the 11 FMMOs. Producers whose milk was pooled on an FMMO in January 2024 are eligible to participate in the referendum. AMS will mail ballots to eligible independent producers and qualified cooperative associations.

Despite stagnant growth and a slight decline in national milk production in recent years, component values have reached new highs and still regularly set new records based on Northeast Order pool reports. An analysis of the trend was given. A table showed Northeast Order component pounds for the month of June, comparing 2014 to 2024. Charts illustrated Order average butterfat, protein, and other solids by producer receipts from January 2015 through October 2024.

November

Projections using the CME Class III and IV milk futures prices suggested the SUP will average \$21.52 per cwt for 2024; an increase of \$1.51 per cwt from the 2023 average. Reviews of some supply and demand factors and economic indicators with a look into 2025 were given. A chart displayed the actual and estimated SUP compared to corn, soybean, and diesel prices for 2021 through projected 2025.

A schedule showed the 2025 dates for partial payments to producers who are not members of cooperatives. The Order requirement was explained.

December

Northeast Order's total milk received from producers in 2024 equaled 26.9 billion pounds, a decrease of 1.4 percent from 2023, adjusted for leap year. The annual average volume per producer continued to set record-highs, although at a slower rate than in the past 9 years and rose 180 pounds from the previous year, topping 10,000 pounds for 3 months during 2024. Selected Northeast Order statistics for 2024 were summarized, and a table compared the Order's pool statistics for 2023 and 2024. A chart illustrated the class utilization of milk pooled on the Order for 2015 through 2024.

Pool data for all federal orders was summarized in a table for January–December, 2023 and 2024.
