

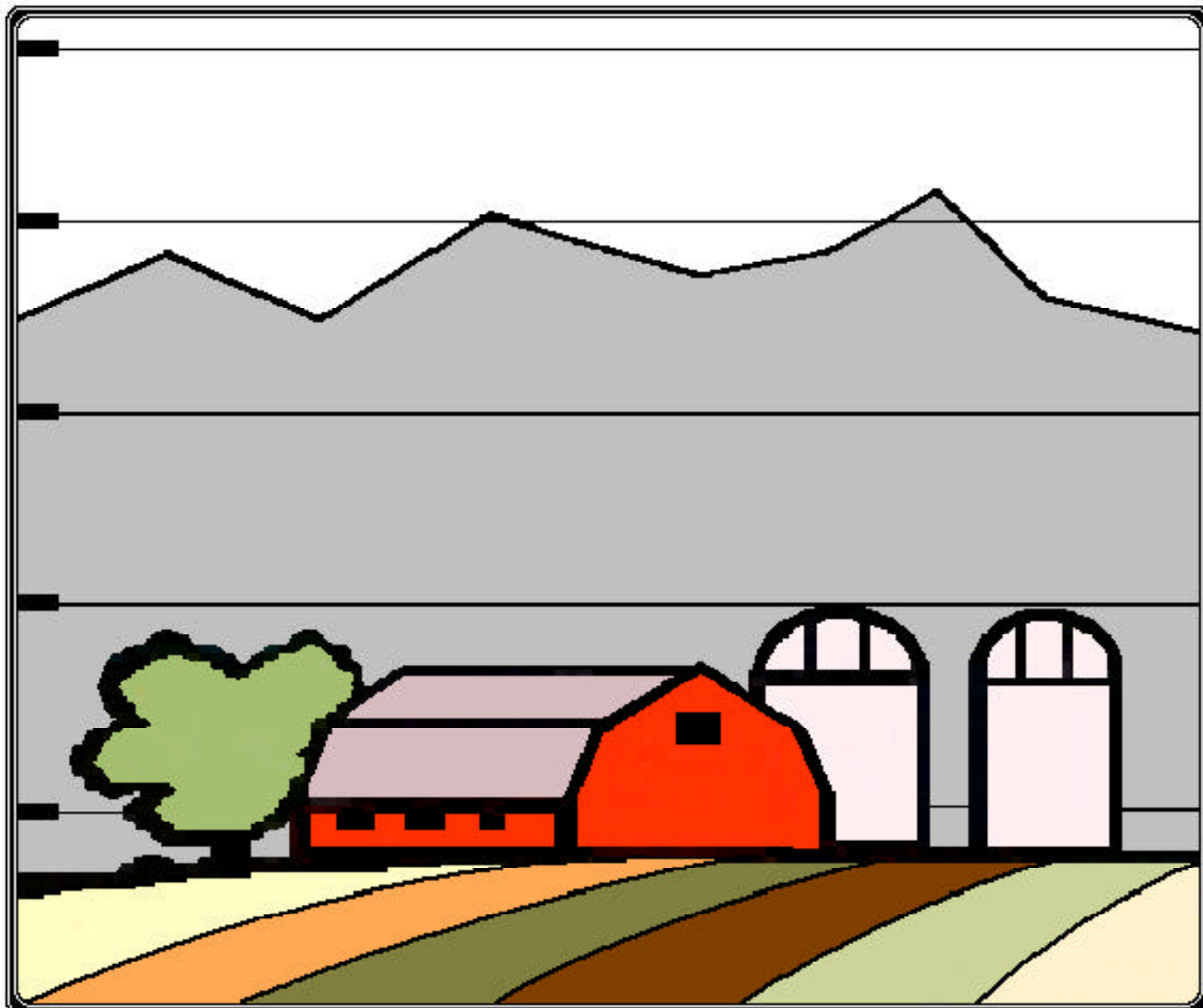

Summary

This bulletin provides information about the operation of the Northeast Order during 2002. The series of tables gives statistical data; some of the data is displayed graphically in figures. The *Bulletin* Highlights section summarizes, on a monthly basis, important events that impacted the dairy industry in 2002. This bulletin also includes lists of handlers and cooperatives operating under the Order.

Producer Milk Receipts

The total volume of milk received from producers increased by over 800 million pounds (3.3 percent) during 2002. Production was strong during the first half of the year in two of the major contributing Northeast states. New York's production increases began to taper off mid-year with November and December actually declining from 2001. Overall, New York's production was up 3.7 percent in 2002. Vermont showed increases during the first 6 months and slight declines in 5 out of the last 6 months of 2002. Pennsylvania faced declines in production throughout all of 2002, except for August.

The average number of producers pooled by handlers regulated under the Order equaled 16,869 in 2002, a greater decline (1.7 percent) than during the previous year (0.7 percent). The year finished with 376 producers less than in December 2001, which was down 172 from the previous year. This decrease is not necessarily a reflection of producer exits as these numbers are greatly affected by pooling changes.

During 2002, DDP averaged 4,117 pounds, an increase of 5.1 percent from 2001. This growth, combined with the decrease in producer numbers, signals a continued trend toward fewer but larger farms.

Class Utilization Changes

Class I utilization averaged 42.2 percent in 2002, down 1.1 percentage points from the previous year. As was the case in 2001, the total volume of milk used in Class I increased, but because of a larger volume of producer milk receipts, the percentage declined. Class II usage increased 7.5 percent resulting in a utilization increase of 0.7 percentage points. Class III volume increased slightly (1.4 percent), but based on the larger total volume, resulted in a 0.6 percentage point decline. Milk used in Class IV jumped 15.6 percent on a volume basis, but only 1.0 percentage points in overall utilization.

Lower Blend Prices

During most of 2002, strong milk production in many of the leading dairy states combined with a decline in demand resulted in considerably lower prices. Prices began to tumble during the fall of 2001, most likely impacted by the fallout of the September 11 attacks that affected nearly every industry. As

consumers stayed closer to home, restaurants—a big dairy product user—suffered. Dairy product surpluses began to build, especially as milk production recovered, and prices plummeted.

Overall, the statistical uniform price (blend) reported at Suffolk County, Massachusetts (Boston), averaged \$12.64 per hundredweight in 2002. This was down 19.3 percent from the previous year. The Class I price, which is based on advance data, dropped 18.6 percent from 2001. Class II, III, and IV annual average prices were all down about 21 percent from the previous year. Once again, the Class IV price was the dominant mover of Class I prices, exceeding the Class III price in 9 months during 2002.

Component Prices

The average price paid per pound to producers for butterfat declined 35.5 percent in 2002. The per-pound annual average protein price actually increased 1 cent from the previous year, while the annual average other solids price dropped. The protein price increase was not due to an increase in the commodity cheese prices, reported by the National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS), as they declined 17 percent from 2001. Rather, it was a result of the method by which the butterfat value is incorporated in the protein price formula. The butterfat value declined due to a 33 percent drop in NASS commodity butter prices during 2002.

Average producer component tests were relatively unchanged. As a result, the drop in component prices equated to a 17.8 percent decline in the total producer component value for 2002.

Support Prices

Purchases of products under the dairy price support program by the Commodity Credit Corporation (CCC) during marketing year (MY) 2001–02 were the highest since MY 1990–91. Each MY begins on October 1 and ends on September 30 of the following year.

During MY 2001–02, purchases consisted mainly of nonfat dry milk (NFDN), although some cheese was bought under the program. No butter has been purchased under the support program since MY 1994–95. Due to strong milk production, especially during the first half of 2002, a surplus grew resulting in lower commodity market prices. This further resulted in increased CCC purchases and inventories.

To try and bring back into balance the CCC prices and market prices, the USDA adjusted the CCC purchase prices for butter and NFDN effective November 15, 2002. The support price for butter increased 19.52 cents to \$1.05 per pound, while the price for NFDN decreased 10 cents to \$0.80 per pound. No changes were made to the purchase prices for block or barrel cheese.

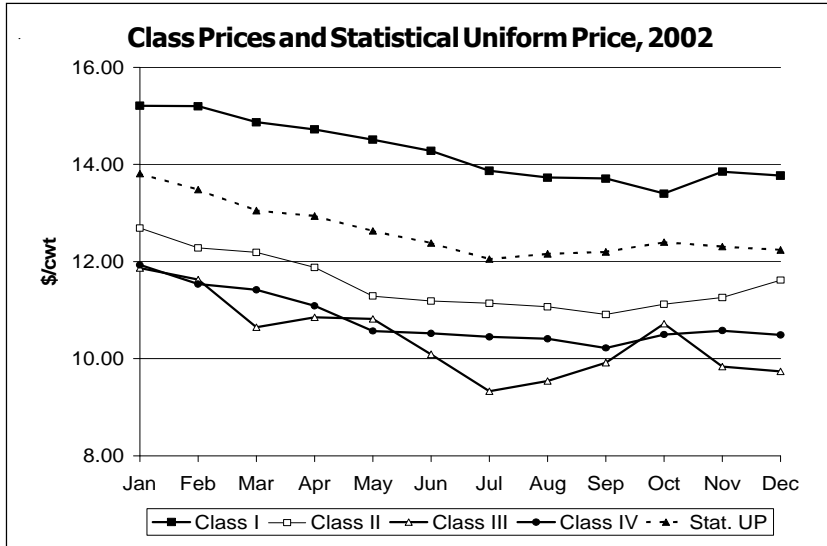

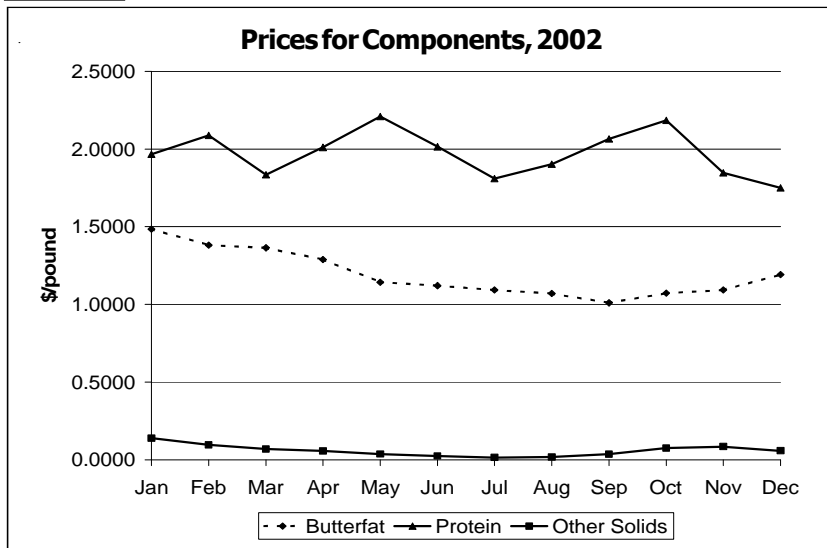
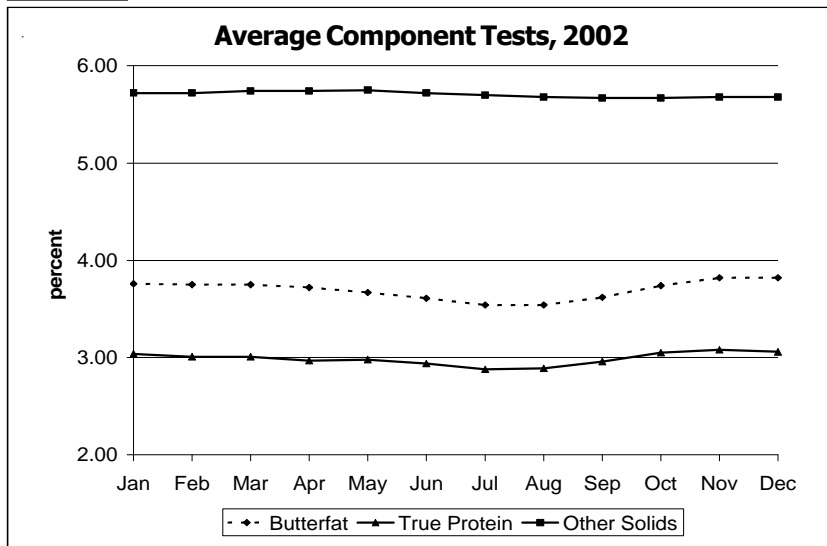

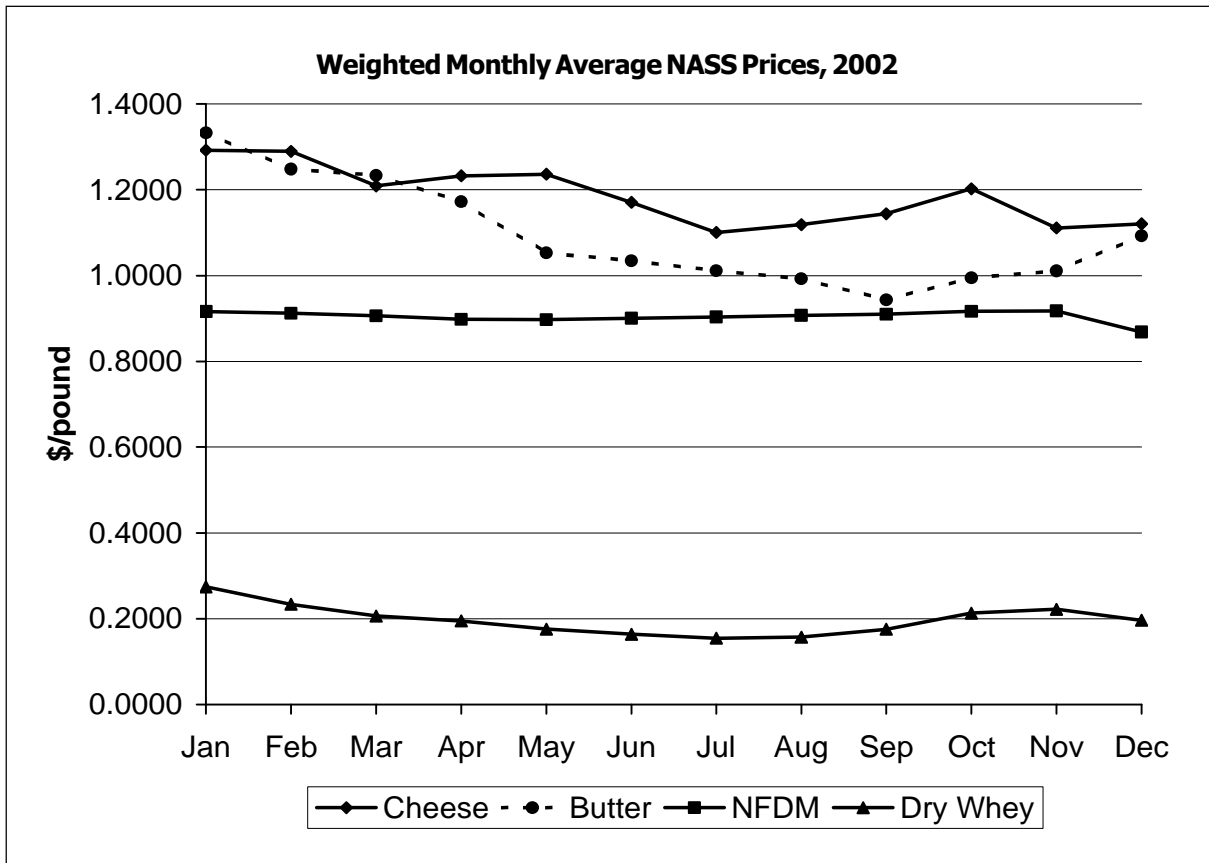

9 Receipts of Milk from Producers by State*, 2002

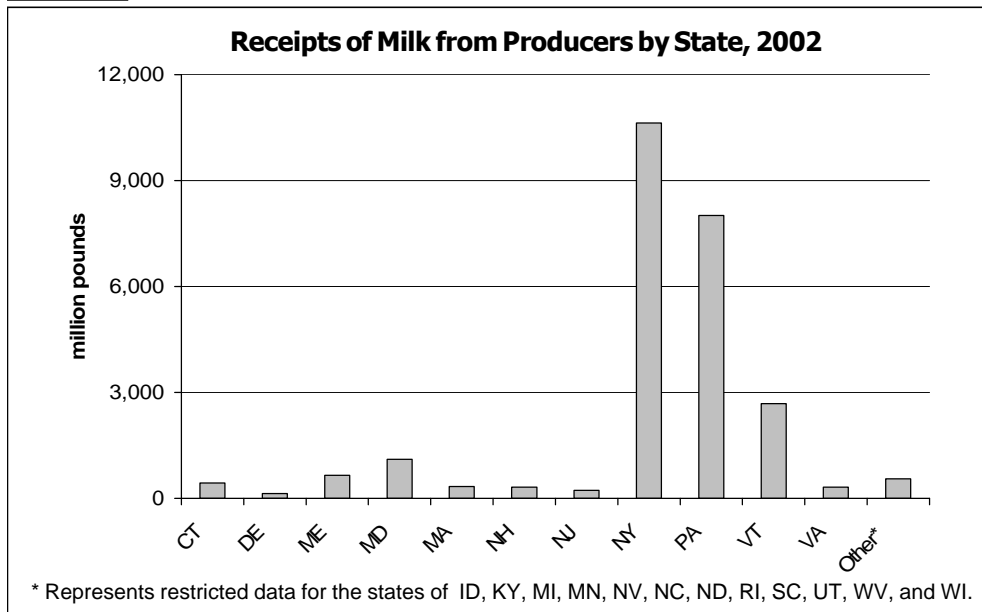

10 Number of Producers by State*, 2002

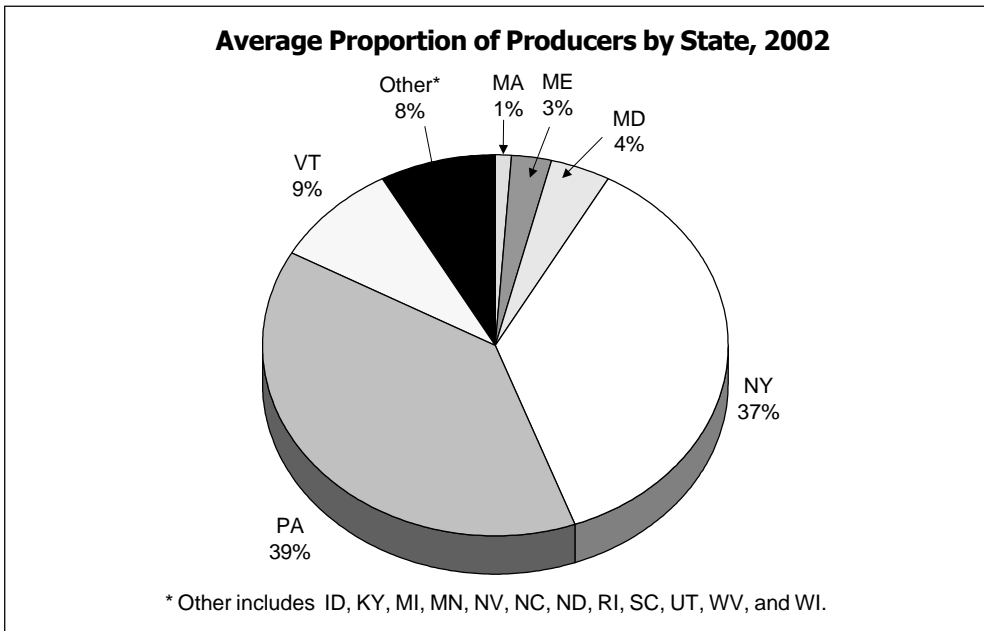

11 Daily Average Output of Producer Milk per Farm by State*, 2002

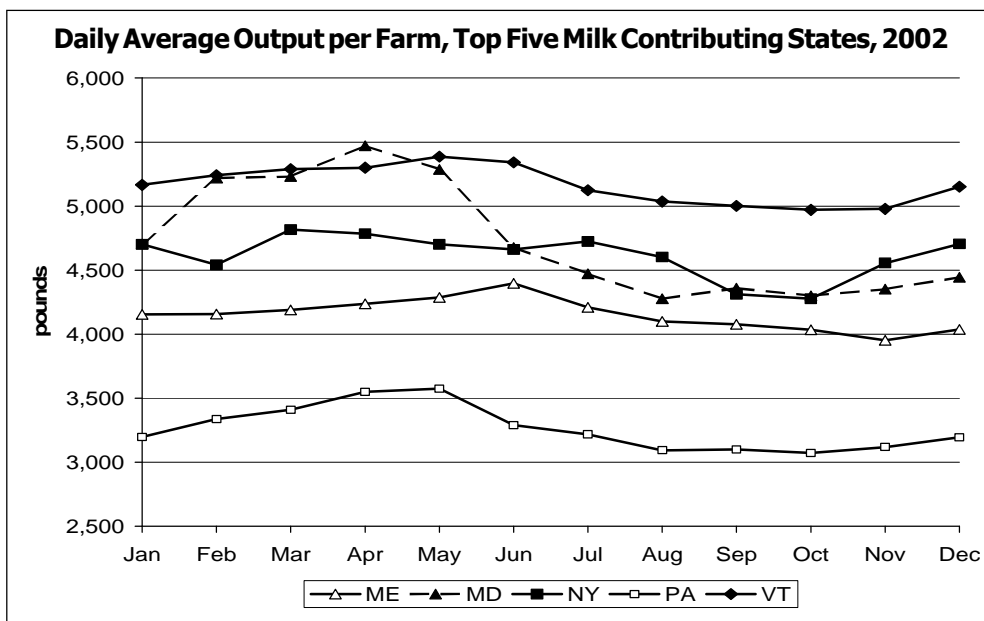

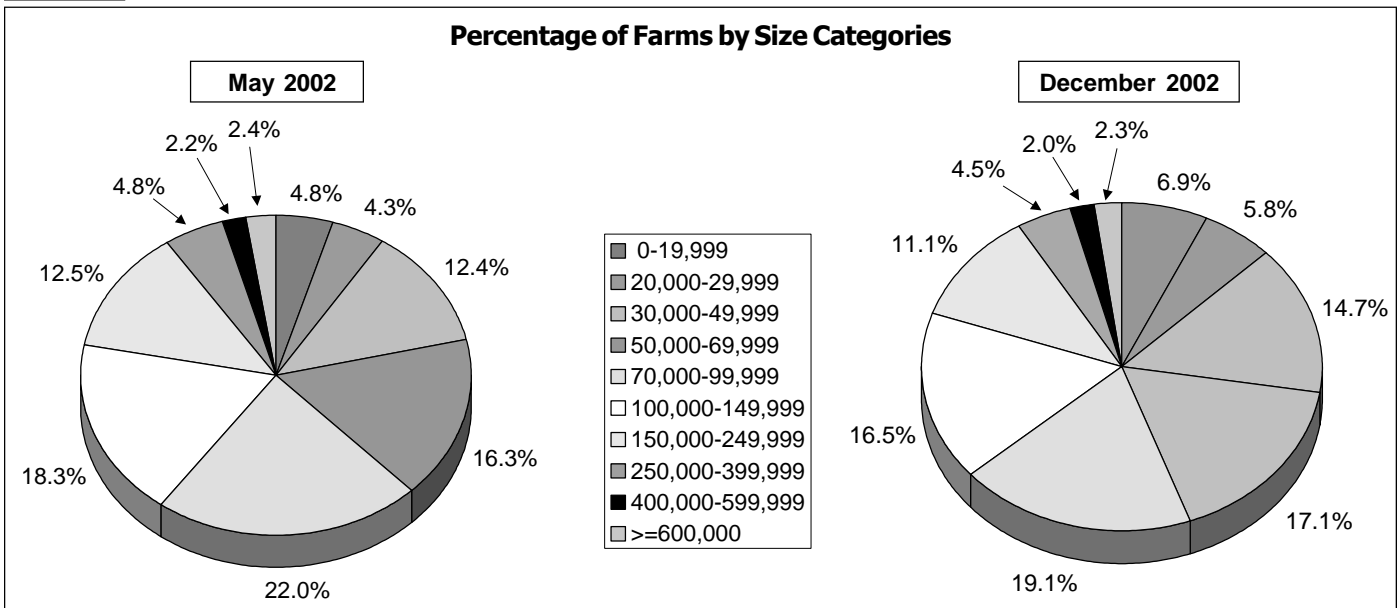

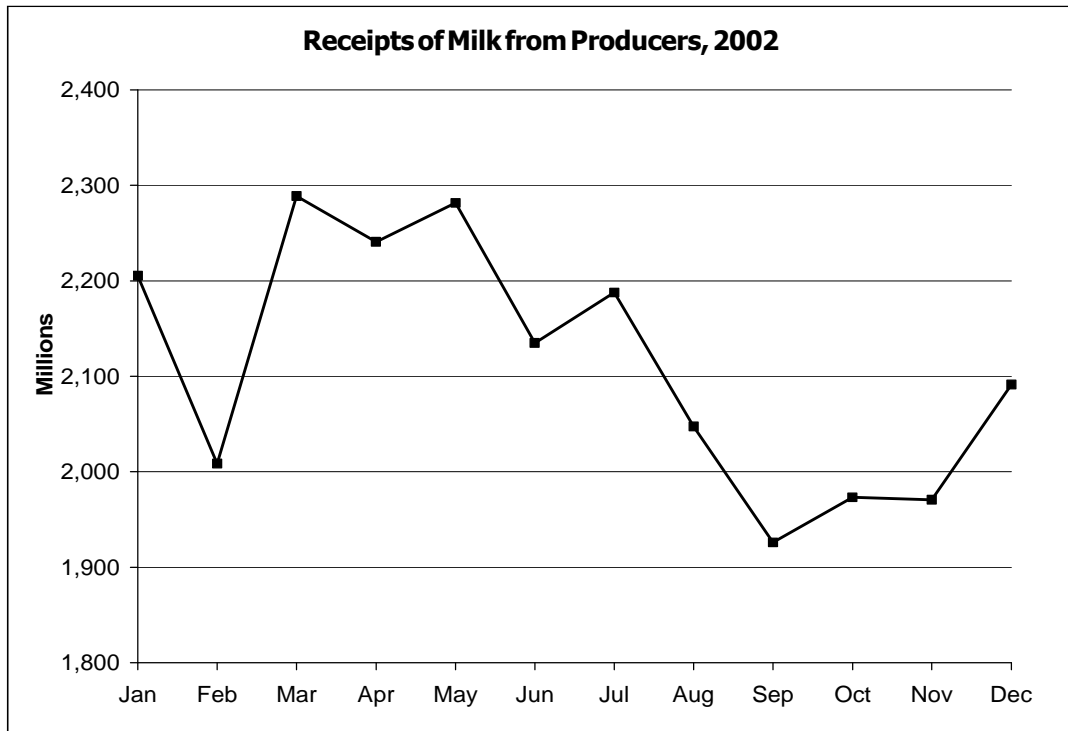

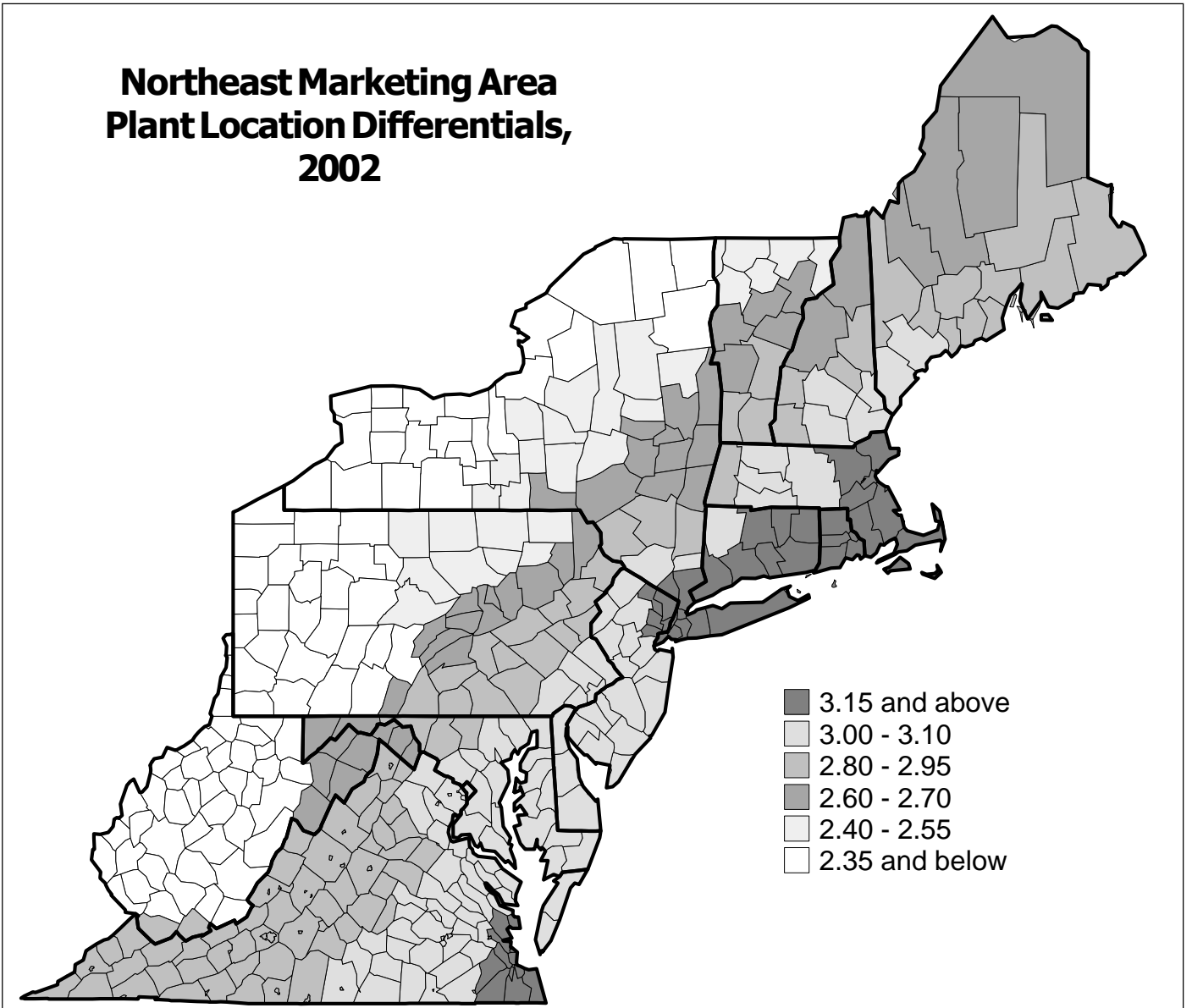

Bulletin Highlights—2002

January

Figures published by the National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS) on the number, hours worked, and wage rates for hired farm workers for two Northeast regions were discussed and shown in a table.

During 2001, total milk production in the United States was down for the first time in 5 years. A table ranked the top ten states by milk production, and a chart illustrated annual milk production from 1997 through 2001.

A map showed the percent of producer milk receipts by state for 2001 under the Northeast Order, along with an explanation.

February

A calendar was given that showed the payment dates for partial and final payments to producers who are not members of cooperatives. Cooperative handlers were not required to follow the schedule.

An explanation and a table were given that showed the amount of milk received from producers by each class at the plants where the milk was priced during 2001.

In January, the Northeast Order expanded its program of packaged milk testing to cover the entire Northeast Marketing Area. The tests were designed to screen packaged milk products and/or verify the amount of fortification in the product.

Grade AA butter prices and 40-pound block Cheddar cheese prices on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange (CME) were illustrated in charts for the years 2000 through the first 5 weeks of 2002. CME's prices were compared with those reported by NASS.

March

The Association of Dairy Cooperatives in the Northeast (ADCNE), representing a significant number of dairy farmers pooled on the Northeast Order, submitted a request for a hearing. The group asked for the hearing to consider changing some features of the pooling and payment provisions of the Northeast Milk Marketing Order and establishing a marketwide service payments program to those entities that serve to balance the Class I needs of the market.

The Market Administrator's bulk tank verification program resumed operation. A tentative calibration truck schedule for April through November 2002 was given. This was the first full year that the program had the services of two calibration trucks.

A pool summary for all federal orders, January-March, 2001-2002, was given in a table.

Total sales of fluid milk products in the Northeast

Marketing Area declined slightly between 2000 and 2001 and also on a per-capita basis. A breakdown by year, product, pounds, and butterfat test was given in a table.

April

President George W. Bush signed the 2002 Farm Bill in May. The bill includes the National Dairy Market Loss Payments Program, under which producers are paid 45 percent of the difference between \$16.94 per hundredweight and the Class I milk price at the Boston location differential under the Northeast Order.

NASS released their *Dairy Products Annual for 2001*, which summarized dairy products manufactured in the United States. A chart presented the whole milk equivalents used in manufactured products.

Questionnaires were mailed to milk producers, handlers, and cooperatives to gather information for a study on the Dairy Forward Pricing Pilot Program.

Butter and cheese prices on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange for 2002 fell below 2001's prices. Charts illustrated Grade AA butter and 40-pound block Cheddar cheese prices for January through October of 2000 through 2002.

May

Producer milk receipts increased 6.4 percent during the "spring flush" months compared with the same period in 2001. The receipts were up 6.6 percent from the total recorded in 2000.

The top ten counties' producer milk receipts in the Northeast Order were shown for 2001.

The November 2001 container sales survey for the Northeast Milk Marketing Area was completed. Charts illustrated sales by container size and product type.

June

The Farm Service Agency's answers to frequently asked questions about the 2002 Farm Bill's National Dairy Market Loss Program were given.

The Northeast Order mailbox prices for January 2000 through March 2002 were illustrated by chart, and the simple average mailbox prices in selected areas for January through March 2001 to 2002 were shown in a table.

Actual and estimated statistical uniform prices for the first 9 months of 2002 were illustrated in a chart.

A pool summary for all federal orders, January-June, 2001-2002, was given in a table.

July

It was announced that a hearing would convene on

September 10 in Alexandria, Virginia, to consider proposals that would amend certain pooling and related provisions of the Northeast Order.

Agriculture Secretary Ann M. Veneman announced that the sign-up for the Milk Income Loss Contract (MILC) program would begin on August 13, 2002.

The USDA amended its "General Specifications for Dairy Plants Approved for USDA Inspection and Grading Service" document. Changes included lowering the maximum allowable somatic cell count in producer herd cow's milk from 1,000,000 per milliliter to 750,000 per milliliter.

The volume exemption level under the Fluid Milk Promotion Order was changed from 500 thousand pounds to 3 million pounds, effective August 1.

Total U.S. milk production increased 2.7 percent during the first 6 months, compared to the same period in 2001. A chart illustrated the percent change from January to June 1998 to 2002, and the top ten states were ranked by milk production from January to June 2002.

August

Net movements to the southeastern United States during August 2002 were compared to shipments during the same month in 2001.

The average component tests in July 2002 for selected states/areas was discussed and shown in a map.

Grade AA butter and 40-pound block Cheddar cheese prices were discussed and represented in charts for the years 2000, 2001, and 2002 for the months of January through October.

Recent changes to the Mideast Order and Pacific Northwest Order were discussed.

September

The composition of the total gross payment to a hypothetical farm was compared for September 2001 and 2002.

The Commodity Credit Corporation (CCC) purchases were the highest since 1991. A table showed CCC dairy products purchases from 1991 through 2002.

A comparison of the average component tests for butterfat, protein, and other solids for the first 3 quarters of 2001 and 2002 was given and shown in graphs.

October

A referendum was in progress on specific revisions in the Class III and IV price formulas. Dairy farmers who shipped milk to handlers regulated under the Northeast Marketing Area were allowed to express approval or disapproval.

The USDA named six new members and reappointed six incumbents to the National Dairy Promotion and

Research Board, and was seeking nominations for the National Fluid Milk Processor Promotion Board.

While there were no changes to the purchase prices for block or barrel cheese, USDA adjusted the purchase prices for butter and nonfat dry milk under the CCC's support program. The price for butter increased, and the nonfat dry milk price decreased, effective November 15, 2002.

Roughly 25 percent of the \$612 million payments under the Milk Income Loss Contract Program were paid to farmers in Northeast states. A table showed the states and their total payments.

A pool summary for all federal orders, January–September, 2001–2002, was given in a table.

November

A calendar was given that showed the payment dates for partial and final payments to producers who are not members of cooperatives. Cooperative handlers were not required to follow the schedule.

The 2002 Northeast Regional Dairy Outlook Conference was held November 19 at the Albany office. A table showed the statistical uniform prices for the years 2001 and 2002, with the 2003 estimated prices.

NASS was to begin conducting the 2002 Census of Agriculture in December 2002.

Tanker loads of milk per day by state and farm size for the month of May 2001 and 2002 were reported and represented in a table.

A map showed the change in milk production in the top 20 milk producing states for January through October 2002.

December

Using data from 2001, USDA's Market Information Branch released a report summarizing the structure of dairy farmers delivering milk to federal orders.

Intermarket movements of milk in and out of the Northeast Order were compared in an accompanying table showing receipts and shipments from September to November of 2000, 2001, and 2002.

Fluid milk product sales declined in 2002 on a total and per capita basis. A table gave a breakdown of products and sales as well as the percent change from 2001 to 2002.

The volume of milk received from producers shipping to handlers regulated under the Northeast Order increased from 2001. Pool statistics for the years 2001 and 2002 were presented in a table.

The transcript and exhibits relative to the hearing held September 10–13, 2002, to consider proposals to make various changes to the Northeast Order were posted on USDA's website.
