

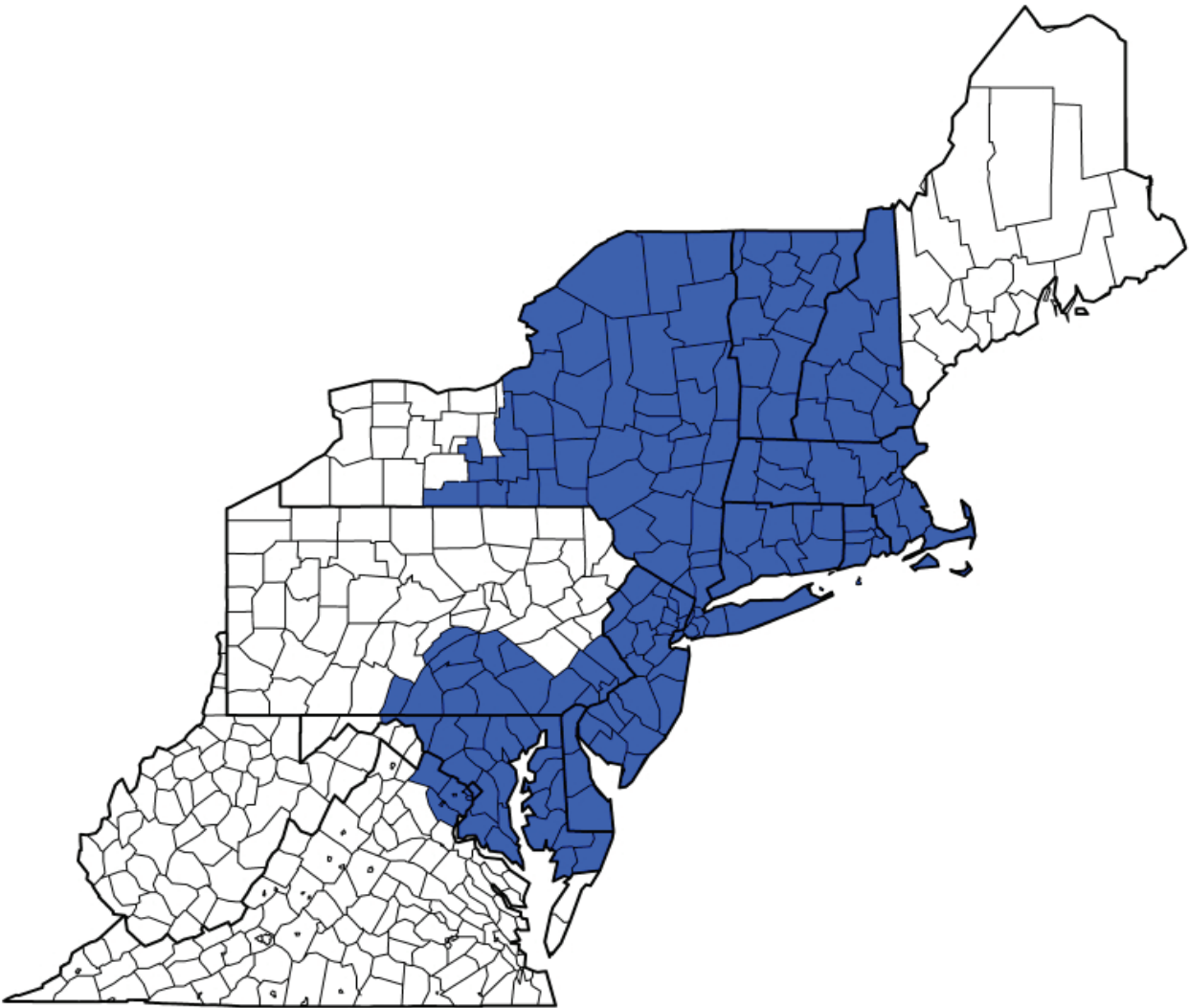

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Summary

This bulletin provides information about the operation of the Northeast Order during 2021 through a series of tables and charts. The *Bulletin* Highlights section summarizes important events that impacted the dairy industry in 2021. Also included are lists of handlers and cooperatives operating under the Order with their respective locations depicted on a map of the region.

Order Volume Increases

Total milk received from producers equaled 27.0 billion pounds in 2021, up 1.1 percent from 2020. The annual average volume per producer grew 340 pounds from the previous year and topped 8,000 pounds every month during 2021. The year ended with 8,749 producers, a drop of 205 from December 2020. Comparisons have not been adjusted for any milk that was not included in the pool (depooling), but they have been adjusted for leap year in 2020.

Class Utilization Changes

Class I utilization averaged 30.1 percent in 2021, down 0.5 percentage points from 2020. The volume of milk used for Class I purposes declined 72.4 million pounds (0.9 percent) from the previous year, the same decrease as in 2020. The total volume of producer receipts used in Class II increased 6.3 percent from 2020. The Class II utilization percentage grew 1.2 percentage points to 25.1 percent of total producer milk pooled in 2021. Total Class II volume was the highest ever since the Order's inception.

Class III volume rose 2.7 percent and utilization averaged 26.3 percent, up 0.4 percentage points from 2020. The amount of milk used in Class IV decreased 4.6 percent and accounted for an annual average of 18.5 percent utilization, a decrease of 1.1 percentage points.

Most Prices Higher Than 2020

During 2020, efforts by the federal government to keep food programs operational and the addition of extra programs kept prices from falling further during the summer months. Without these programs in 2021, market forces prevailed. Even though cheese exports grew, domestic demand declined. As a result, prices were mixed for 2021, but overall, the statistical uniform price was higher.

Commodity Prices—National Dairy Product Sales Report (NDPSR) butter prices were up 9.6 percent from 2020, averaging \$1.7325 per pound. NDPSR cheese prices rose at the beginning of the second

quarter of 2021 but fell again before rising during the last quarter of the year. Overall, the combined cheese price averaged \$1.6755, down 12.9 percent, with blocks falling 15.3 percent and barrels dropping 10.1 percent.

The NDPSR nonfat dry milk price increased 21.8 percent from 2020, averaging \$1.2693 per pound. Dry whey prices jumped 58.7 percent from the previous year, averaging \$0.5744 per pound.

Component Prices—All component price averages were above the previous year except protein. The price paid to producers for butterfat averaged \$1.8904 per pound, up 10.8 percent from 2020. The per-pound annual average protein price was \$2.7630 per pound, down 26.4 percent from the previous year's average. The other solids price averaged \$0.3866 per pound, more than double the price in 2020. The nonfat solids price averaged \$1.0905 per pound, an increase of 26.1 percent from the previous year. Both the other solids and nonfat solids prices were the highest since 2014.

Class Prices—Annual average class price changes were mixed. The Class I price averaged \$20.08 per hundredweight in 2021, down 0.4 percent from the 2020 annual average. The Class II price averaged \$16.44 per hundredweight, up 15.0 percent from the previous year. The Class III price averaged \$17.08, a decrease of 5.9 percent from 2020. The Class IV price averaged \$16.09, an increase of 19.3 percent. Overall, the statistical uniform price (blend) reported at Suffolk County, Massachusetts (Boston) averaged \$17.88 per hundredweight, 4.6 percent above the 2020 average. The producer price differential (PPD) averaged \$0.80 per hundredweight (at Boston) for the year.

Producer Tests

The annual average producer butterfat test equaled 3.99 percent in 2021, an increase of 0.07 percentage points from 2020. Monthly record-highs were set every month of 2021 and a new Order high set in December at 4.14 percent. The annual average producer protein test was 3.15 percent, up 0.04 percentage points from the previous year. Monthly record-highs were set in 11 months of 2021 and a new Order high set in November at 3.25 percent. The producer other solids test averaged 5.77 percent, unchanged from 2020. Monthly record-highs were set in 3 months of the year. February's other solids test tied with the Order record-high set in May 2020 at 5.79 percent.

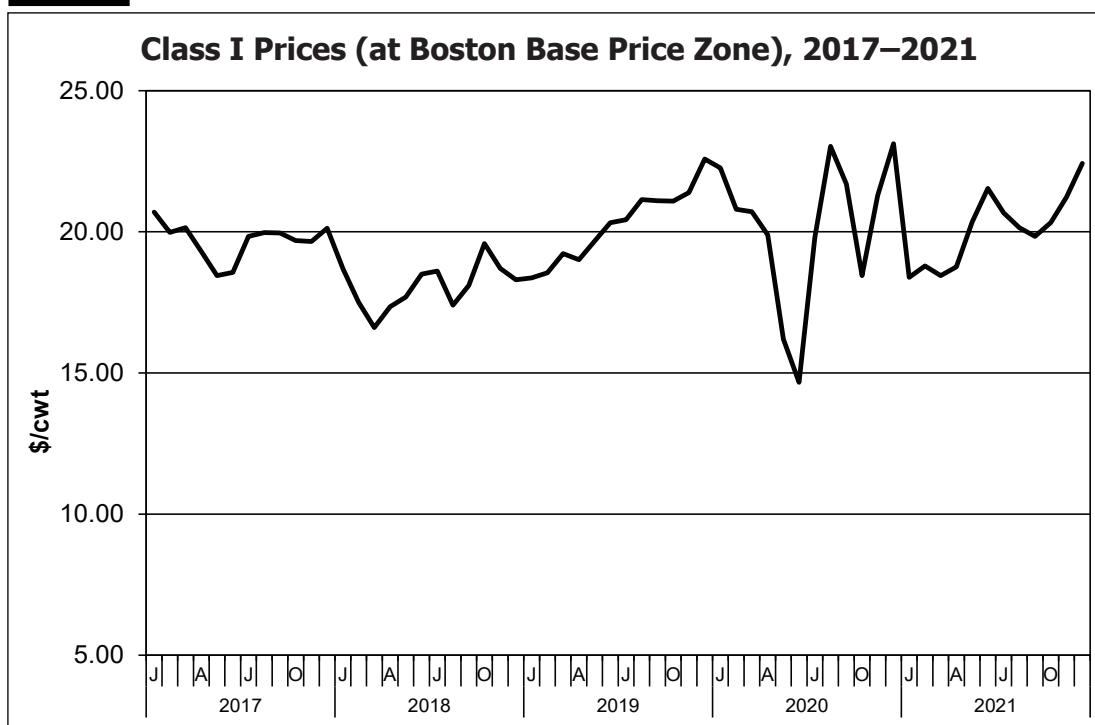

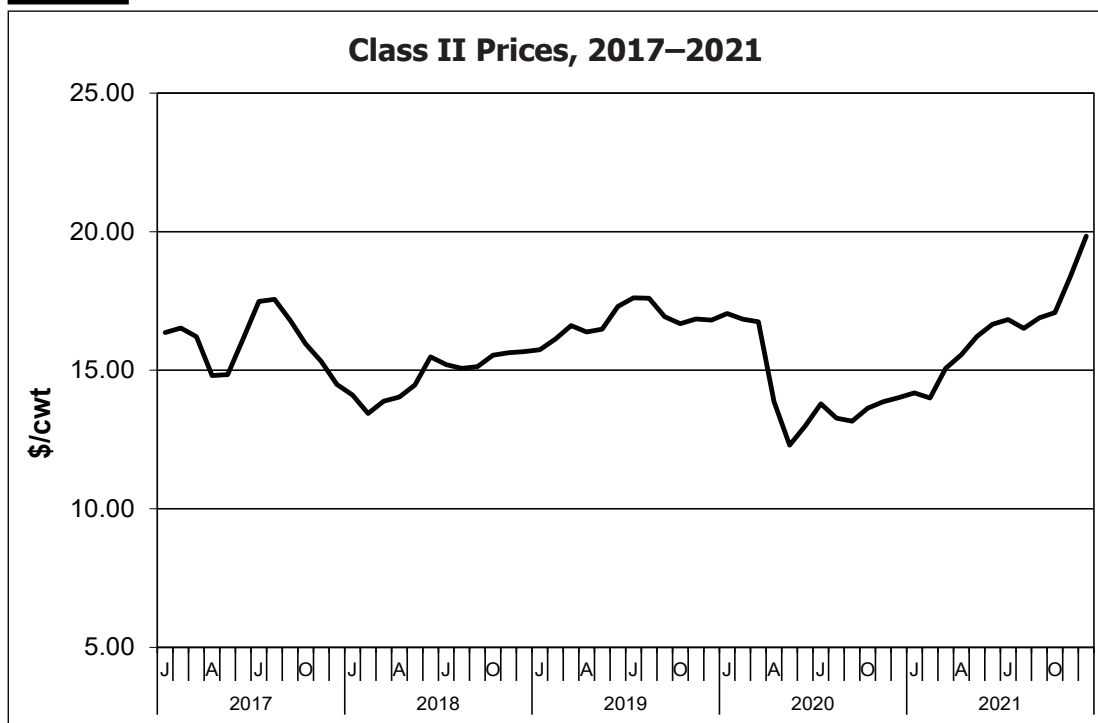

2 Class II Prices, 2017–2021

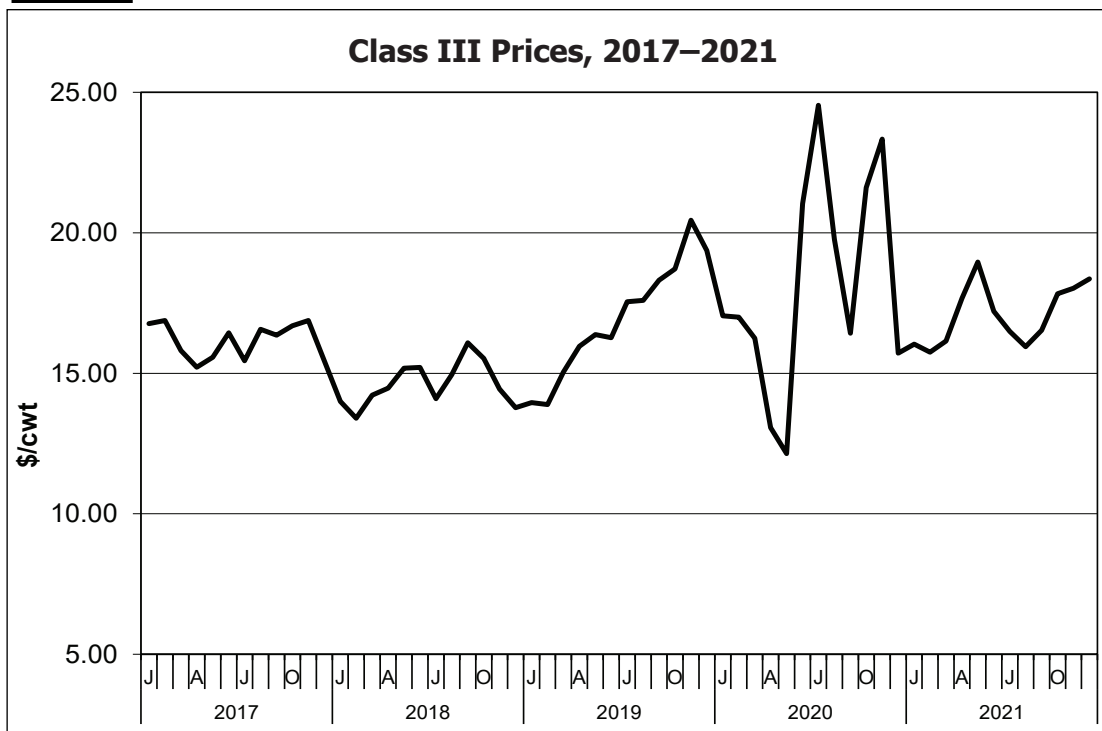

3 Class III Prices, 2017–2021

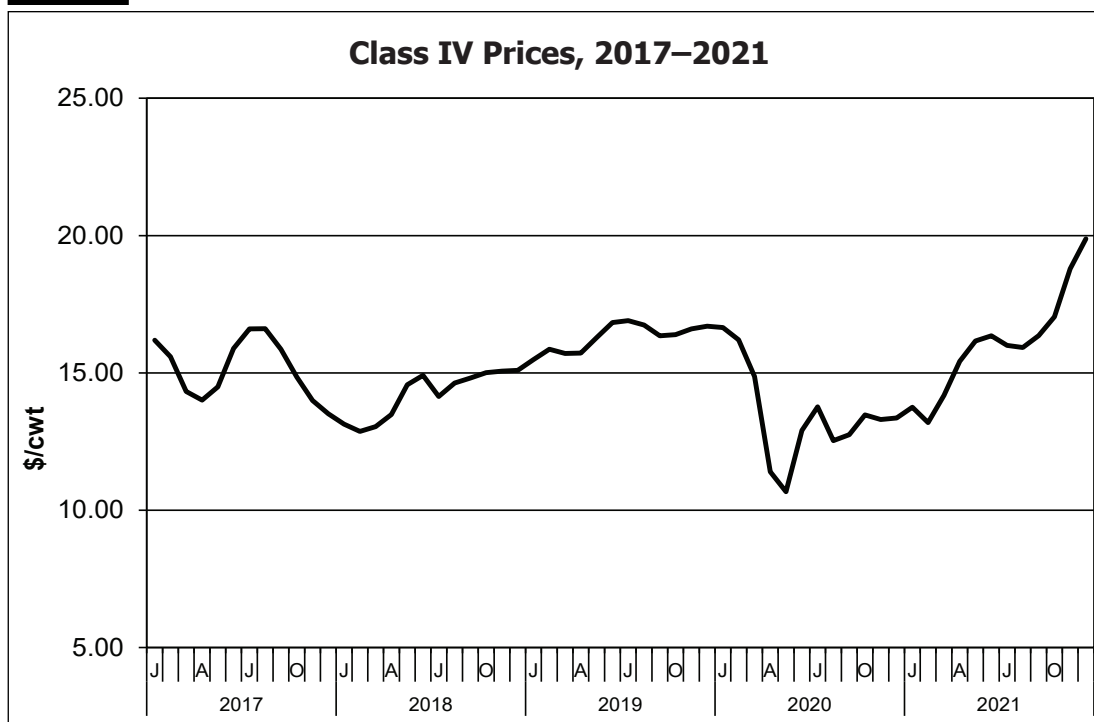

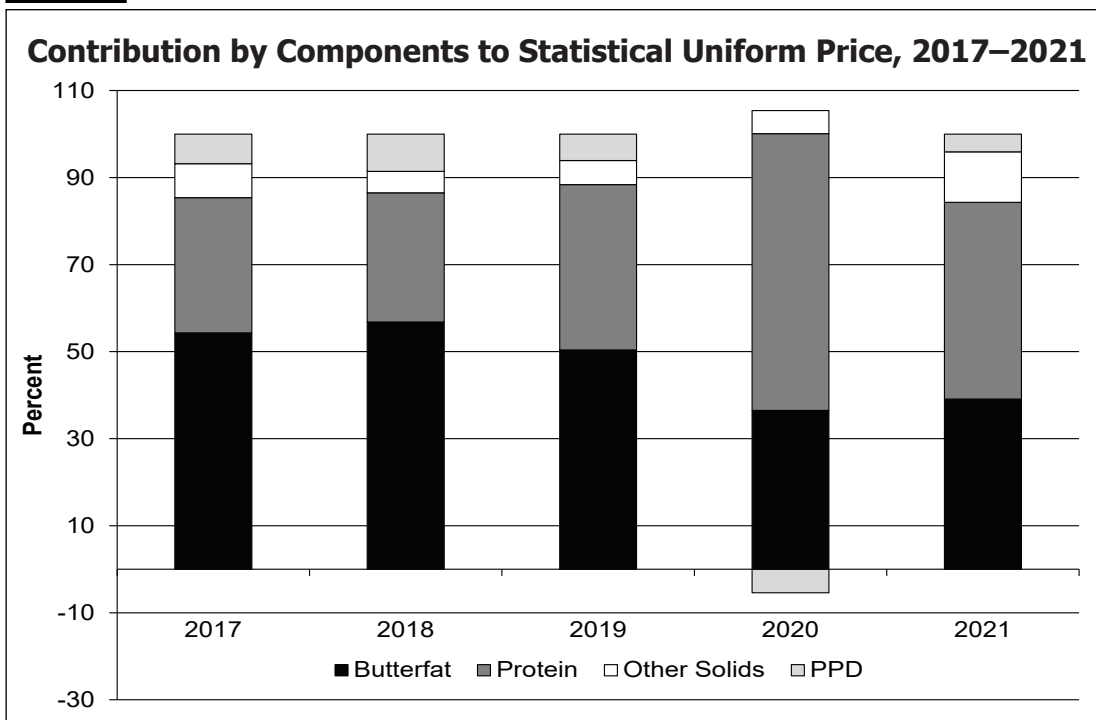

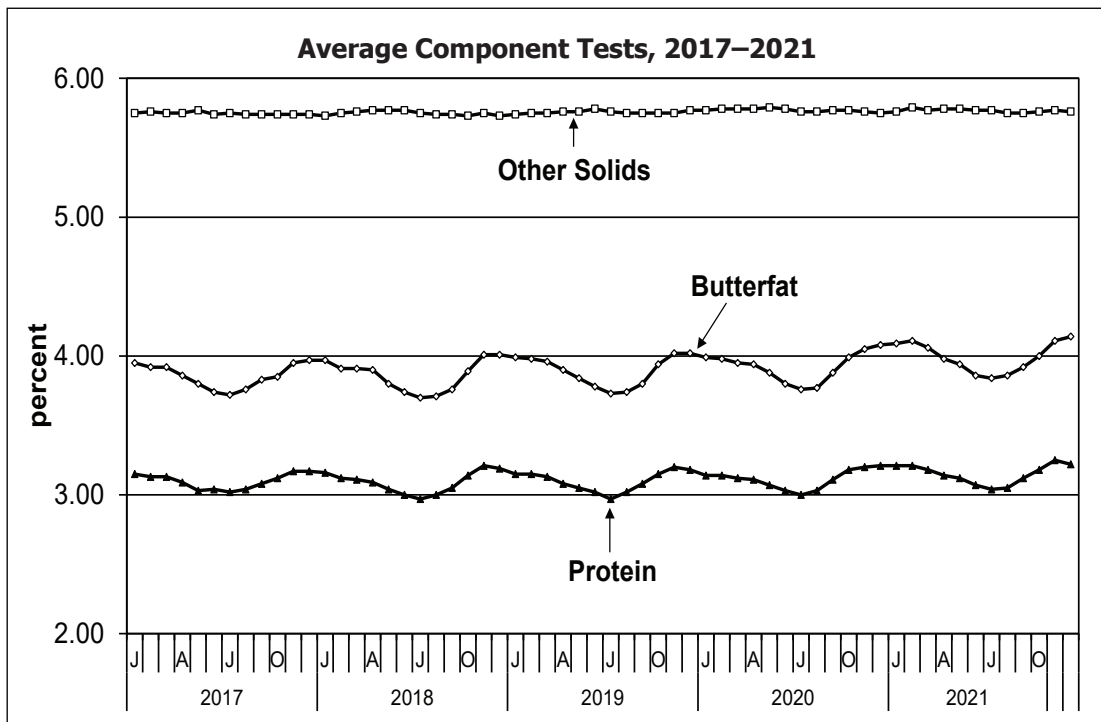

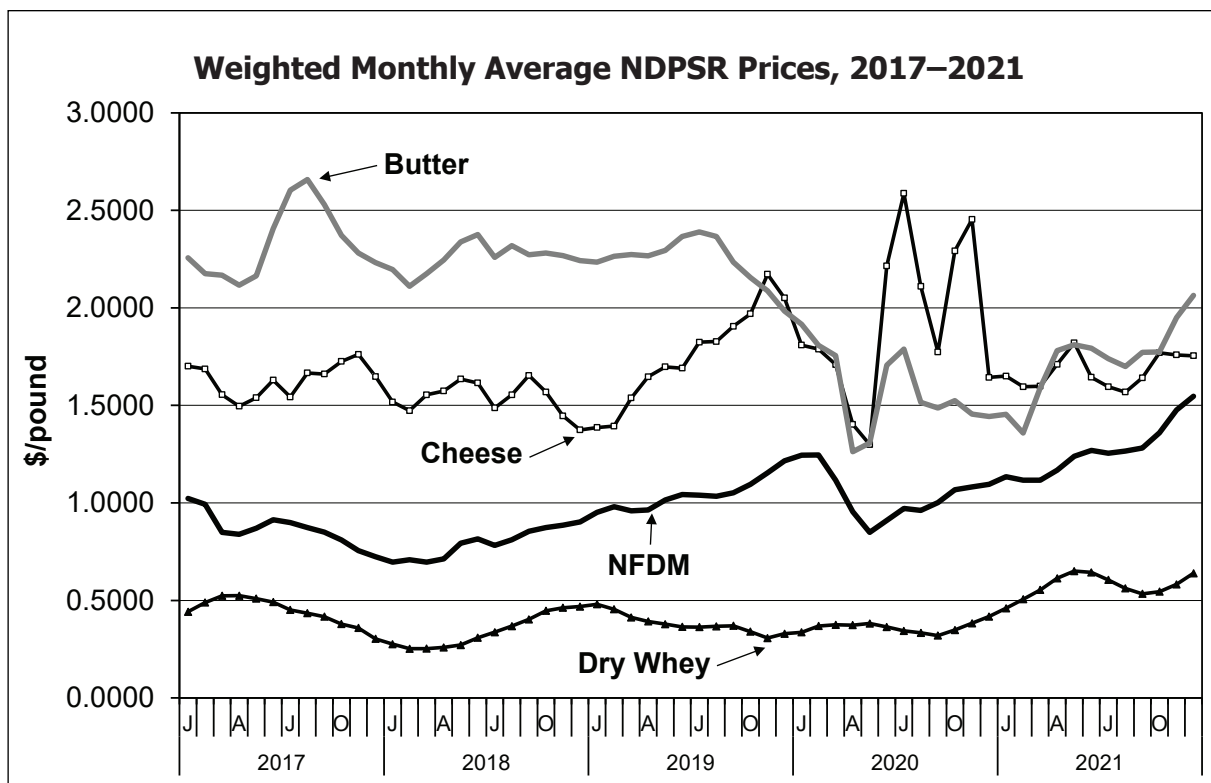

Receipts of Milk from Producers, by State*, 2021

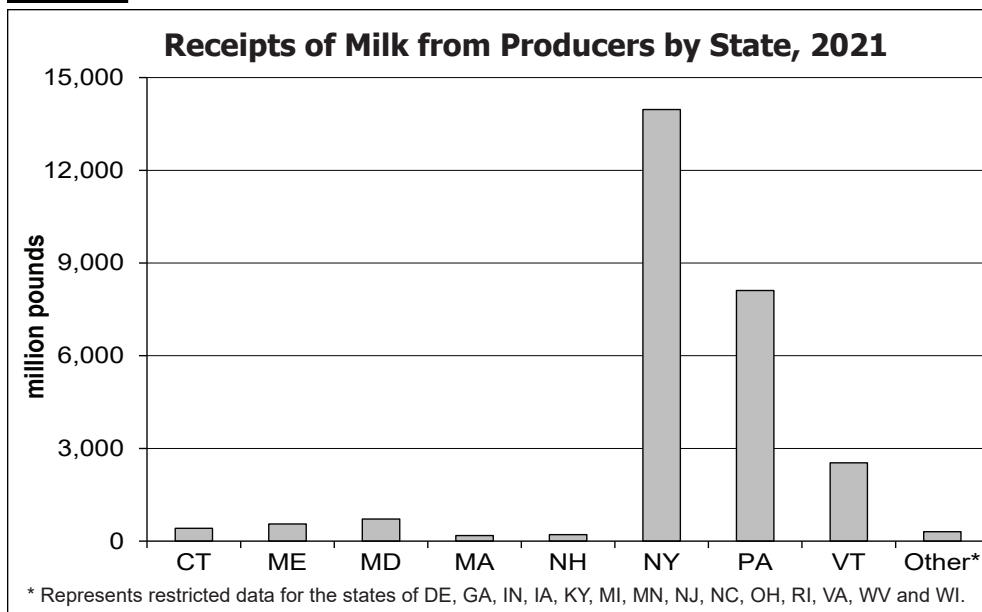

10 Number of Producers Pooled on the Order, by State*, 2021

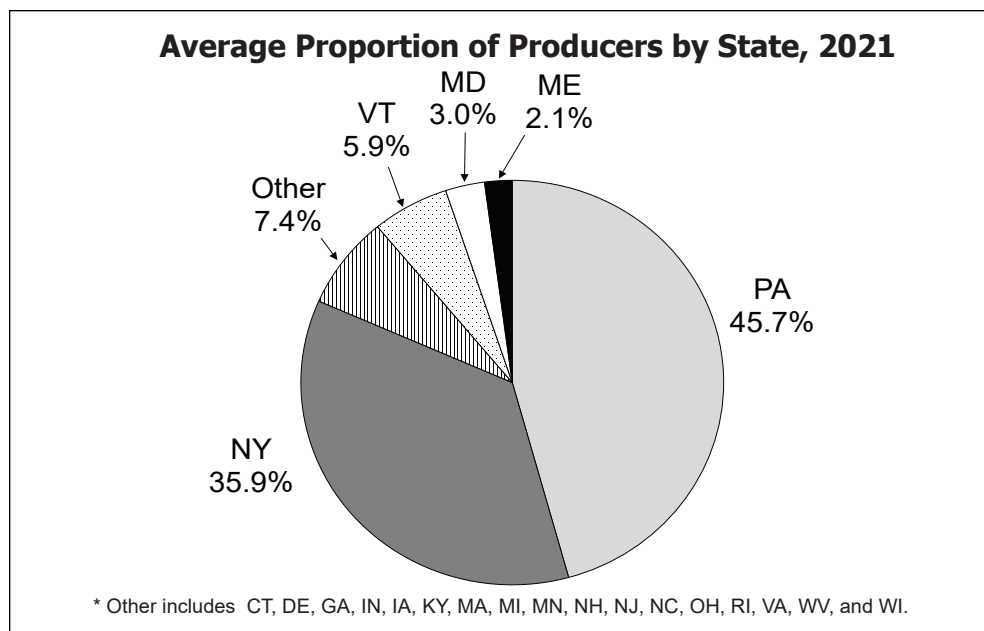

11 Daily Average Output of Milk per Producer, by State*, 2021

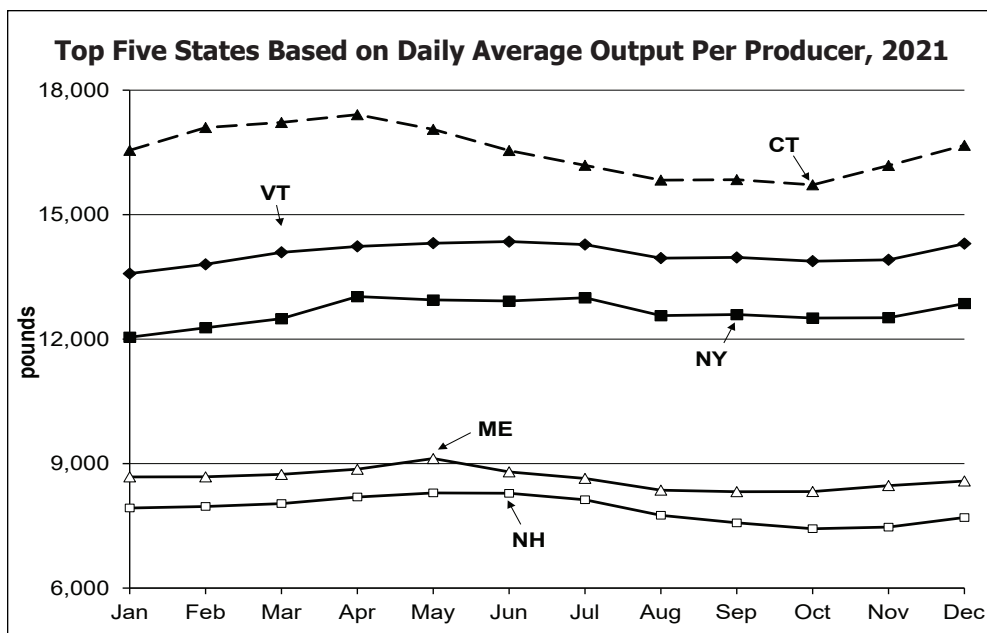

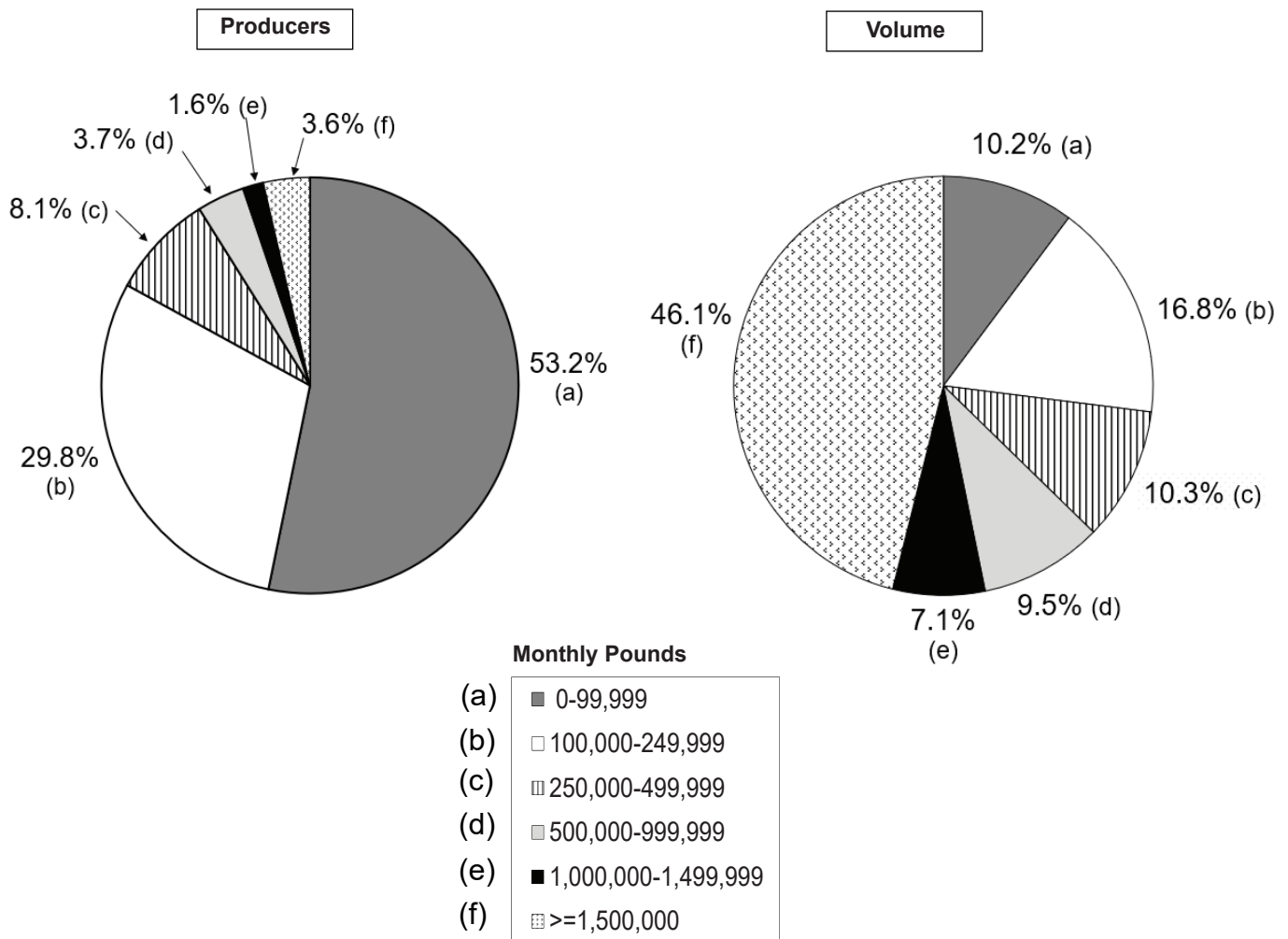

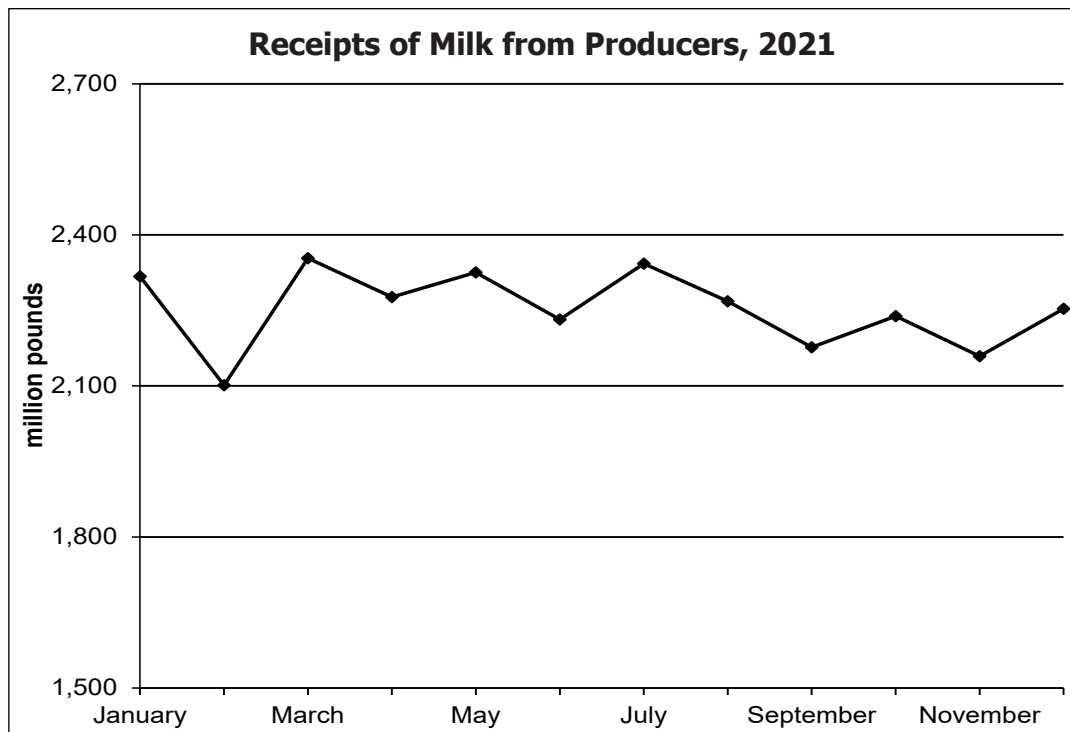

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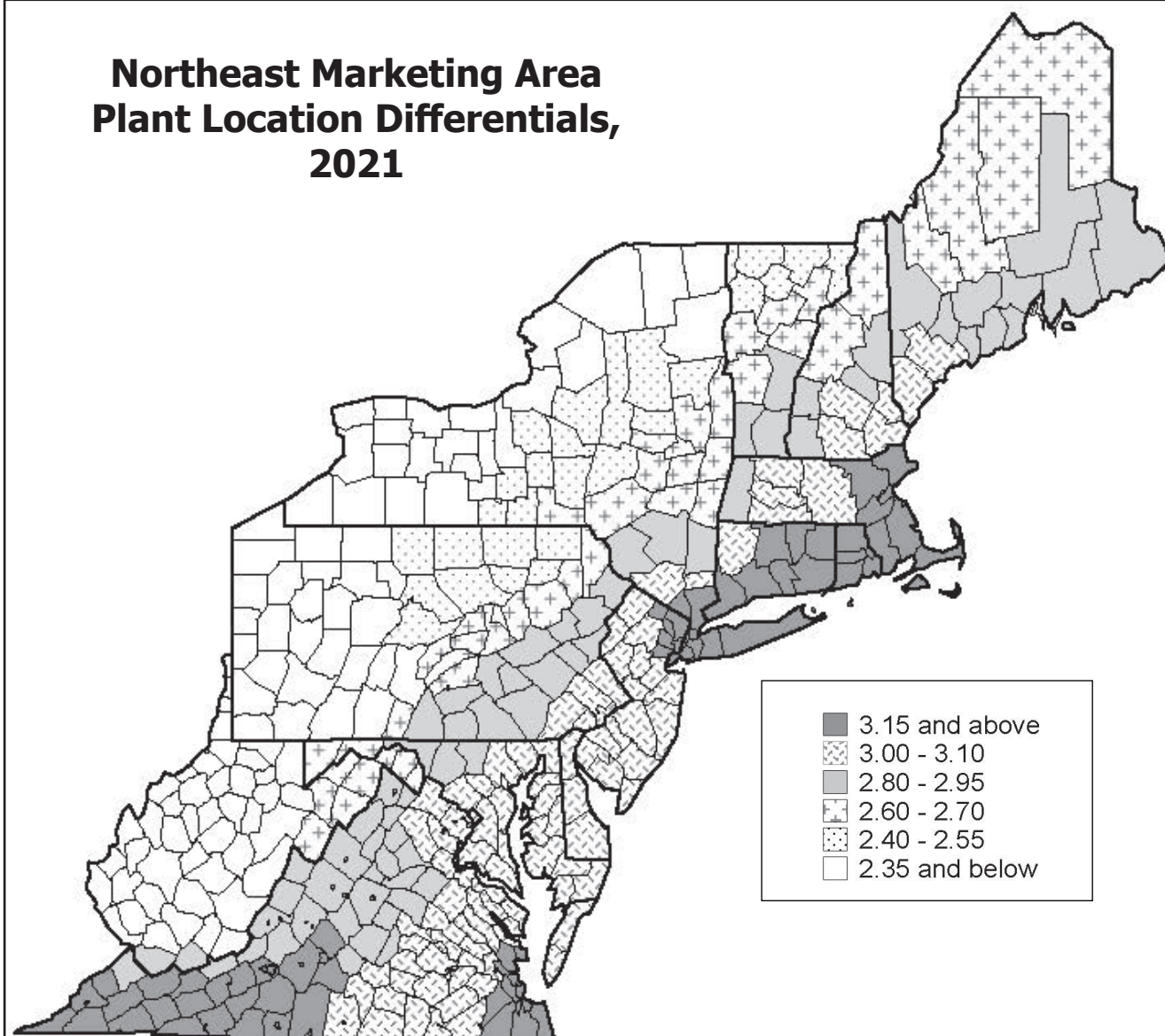

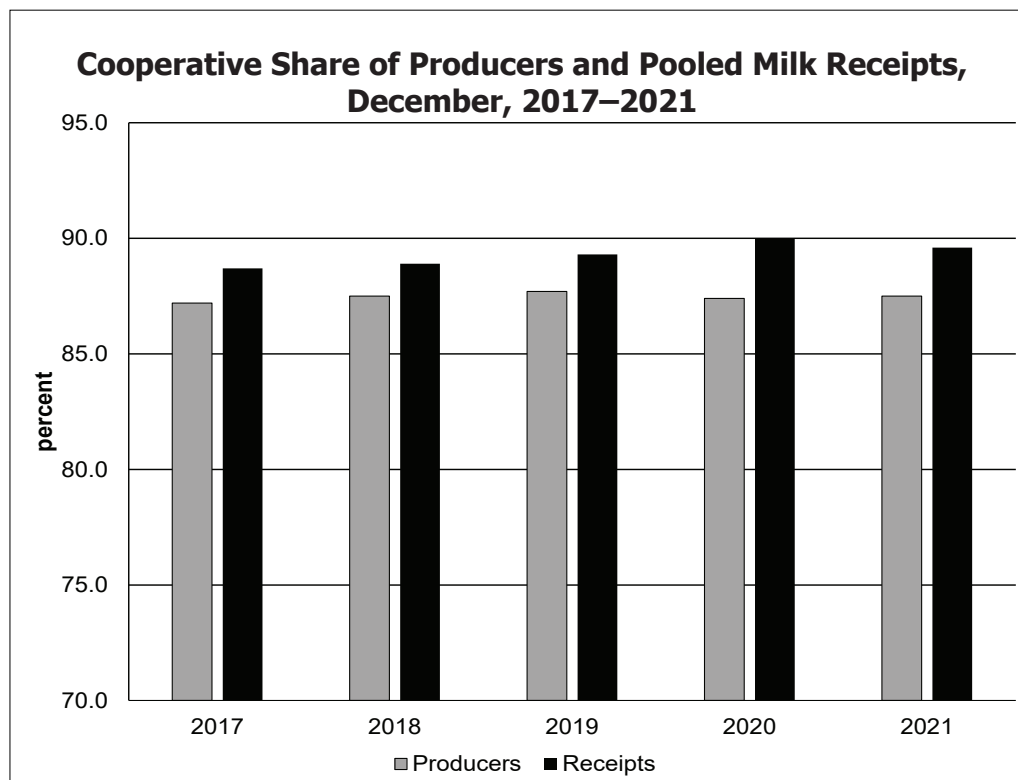

Bulletin Highlights — 2021

January

The 2020 market service program was summarized. An overview of the calibration program was given, as were the results of tank checks/calibrations. A chart illustrated tank checks and calibrations by tank size for 2020. A table announced the tentative calibration truck schedule for 2021.

Northeast Marketing Area (NMA) trends in packaged sales were discussed. A table showed changes in sales by product in the NMA for 2020 compared to selected years. A table compared total per capital sales between the NMA and United States from 2015 through 2020.

February

U.S. milk total production rose 1.9 percent in 2020, the largest year-to-year increase since 2014. Milk production, cow numbers, and production per cow were compared for the U.S. and Northeast milkshed for 2020 vs 2019. A table showed selected statistics for the top ten states ranked by 2020 milk production.

A discussion was held on Northeast Order class and component prices, along with an updated outlook on the projected 2021 Statistical Uniform Price (SUP). A chart illustrated National Dairy Product Sales Report (NDPSR) weekly commodity prices used in determining federal order prices from March 2020 through February 2021.

March

Changes in rankings and the proportion of farms and daily deliveries per producer (DDP) in the top ten Northeast Order counties in 2020 were discussed. A map depicted the top ten counties: their rank and percent change in pounds, farm numbers, and DDP from 2019 to 2020. A table showed milk production, number of farms, and average DDP in the top ten counties pooling on the Order for 2020.

Thomas J. Vilsack's confirmation as the 32nd Secretary of the U.S. Department of Agriculture on February 23, 2021, by the U.S. Senate was announced.

Pool data for all federal orders was summarized in a table for January–March, 2020 and 2021.

April

The difference components make in computing the SUP using standardized tests versus pool average component tests were discussed and illustrated in a chart from January 2001 through April 2021. An overview was given on trends of producer components. Charts displayed the Northeast Order SUP at pool average tests versus standardized tests, the difference between the standardized and average pool component SUPs, and butterfat, protein, and other solids tests from January 2015 through April 2021.

May

The USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS) released their *Dairy Products 2020 Summary*. Changes in national cheese production and other selected products, top manufacturing states, and percent of total milk production were discussed. A table highlighted selected products' changes from 2019 and 2015 to 2020, and a comparison of Northeast Order milk used in the manufacture of these products.

Based on Chicago Mercantile Exchange (CME) futures prices and estimates of Northeast Order class utilizations, the SUP at the Boston, MA, location was projected to average \$19.26 per hundredweight (cwt) for the rest of the months of 2021. A chart illustrated NDPSR weekly prices from June 2020–May 2021.

June

Comparisons of the changes in utilization of milk products for the March–May period of 2020 to the 3 years prior and to 2021 were discussed. An accompanying table displayed year-to-year changes in milk used in selected products for those time periods.

The Market Administrator approved lowering the shipping percentage. An explanation of a request and decision on lowering the percentage of milk that pool supply plants and cooperative Section 1000.9(c) handlers must deliver to Class I pool distributing plants for the months of September, October, and November for the Northeast Order was given.

Pool data for all federal orders was summarized in a table for January–June, 2020 and 2021.

July

Milk production for the U.S. for the first 6 months of 2021 was compared to the same time period in 2020. A table showed the top ten states ranked by milk production and selected areas for 2020 vs 2021. A map illustrated the year-to-year percent change in milk production for the NASS 24 major states for January through June 2021. Northeast Order pool volume was discussed.

Producer component tests for butterfat and protein have increased significantly for the first 7 months of 2021. Charts illustrated average butterfat and protein tests for selected years.

U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) announced the details of the Pandemic Market Volatility Assistance Program. The assistance is part of a larger package including permanent improvements to the Dairy Margin Coverage (DMC) safety net program.

August

Commodity prices and stocks were updated. The SUP at the Boston, MA, location was projected to average \$18.50 per cwt for the remaining months of 2021. Charts displayed butter, cheese, nonfat dry milk, and whey prices versus stock volumes from January 2020 through July 2021.

USDA announced a Dairy Donation Program to facilitate timely dairy product donations while reducing food waste. An explanation of the program was given.

September

The SUP for the first 9 months of 2021 averaged almost 60 cents higher than the most recent 5-year average for the same period. NASS feed prices and DMC payments were discussed. Charts illustrated feed prices from January 2011 through August 2021 and DMC prices from January through August 2021.

USDA announced they have been actively implementing the administration of the Pandemic Market Volatility Assistance Program that will

distribute up to \$350 million in payments directly to dairy farmers. Program updates were given.

Pool data for all federal orders was summarized in a table for January–September, 2020 and 2021.

October

The metric tons of dairy product on a milk solids basis reported by the U.S. Dairy Export Council had a year-to-year 12.2 percent increase when compared to the January to September 2020 period. An overview of dairy exports, as a major component of the U.S. dairy market, was given. A chart displayed NFD, skim milk powder, cheese, whey and total milk solids export quantities from January 2019 through September 2021.

The declining trend in fluid milk sales in the NMA continued in 2021 with sales in all categories dropping except for organic and flavored milk. Tables displayed sales and proportion of sales of selected products in the NMA comparing 2021 to 2018, 2019, and 2020. A table showed NMA versus estimated U.S. total per capita sales comparing 2021 to 2018, 2019, and 2020.

November

The Northeast SUP was forecast to finish the year 2021 with an increase of \$0.77 per cwt over the 2020 average. Cost, demand, and supply factors were analyzed for 2021 and predicted for 2022. A chart displayed the actual and estimated SUP compared to corn, soybean, and diesel prices for 2012 through projected 2022.

A schedule showed the 2022 dates for partial payments to producers who are not members of cooperatives. The Order requirement was explained.

December

Northeast Order's total milk received from producers in 2021 increased 1.1 percent from 2020. Selected Northeast Order statistics for 2021 were summarized, and a table compared the Order's pool statistics for 2020 and 2021. A chart illustrated the class utilization of milk pooled on the Order for 2021.

Pool data for all federal orders was summarized in a table for January–December, 2020 and 2021.
